ALABAMIANS WIN MID-SOUTH

Alabamians had a field day at Memphis in the Mid-South as they swept the first three places despite tough opposition from Tennessee and Arkansas. Perhaps they wanted to get even with Tennesseans winning their tournaments. Winner was the pro-tournament favorite, Milan Momic, of Muscle Shoals, scoring 5-1, yielding only two draws to Appleberry and Hurt. Martin Appleberry of Huntsville was a clear second with $4\frac{1}{2}$ points. Third place was taken by Charles Bonner, also of Huntsville with four points. Fourth thru sixth went to Majood Nahas of Lake Hamilton, Ark., ahead of James Wright, Millington, Tenn. and John Reh of Huntsville. All had $3\frac{1}{2}$.

This has been one of the most successful Mid-Souths in recent years, thanks in part to the participation of members of the Junior Chess Club of Nashville. In all there were eight players from Nashville. Memphis as the host had only three more players with eleven players. As expected there were many surprises and upsets. Perhaps the greatest was John Hurt of Memphis being upset by lower rated Nashvillians Tony Estes and Joe Jones.

The Amateur was also won by an Alabama player; Paul Hargett of Sheffield with five points. Two thirteen year olds (and youngest in tourney) fought it out for second place with the notch going to Mark Swanson of Nashville over Ken Thomas of Memphis after tie-breaking. Both had $4\frac{1}{2}$ points.

Two players joined USCF. Sixteen players joined or renewed their membership in TCA. The event was directed by Peter Lahde.

TSITSEKLIS WINS AT KNOXVILLE

While players from West and Middle Tennessee fought it out in Memphis after Thanksgiving; East Tennesseans gathered in Knoxville for the East Tennessee Holiday Special. With a perfect score of 5-0, Emanuel Tsitsoklis of Knoxville was the winner. A surprise was the second place taken by newcomer Arthur Moore, also of Knoxville, with 4 points. Third place went to Jack Murphy of Maryville with $3\frac{1}{2}$ points.

The event was well attended with 19 players from Knoxville, Maryville and Oak Ridge. This tournament was held only for the first time. A fine job by Bill Irwin of Knoxville in organizing and directing the event.

BURRIS WINS BORNEO GAMBIT TOURNAY

A new experiment in the way of tournaments was tried with this "Wild Man of Borneo Gambit Tournament", played Dec. 8 in Knoxville. This is reminiscent of the King's Gambit Tourney that took place at Vienna in 1903. Only here all of the true gambits could be played.

Of course, such a tournament could not be USCF rated and is not everyone's cup of tea. Also the games were 30-30 (thirty minutes per game for each player) and therefore did not last over an hour. But nevertheless, six players had a go at it. As might be expected, White scored 68%, Black only 32%, with no draws. The most popular gambits were the Boden-Kieseritsky and the Sokolsky. Most gambits appeared twice or more, except the Danish and the Fonziano, which were played only once.
