## THE 1985 TENNESSEE SCHOLASTIC

With 236 players and 29 teams the Tennessee Scholastic was again Tennessee's main attraction of the year. Auburndale School in Cordova was charged with tension Feb. 23-24 as teams and players battled for their spot at the top. Records were set and upsets abounded as all sections, other than the High School Novice, produced clear winners!

The 18-player High School Section saw Ronald Bruner of Nashville Overton make it three-in-a-row, dominating the field by 1.5 points. With more wins he will eclipse Curt Jones' record for consecutive wins. Chuck Lovingsood of Cumberland County came in second with 3.5 while third place was awarded to Gene Woods who, along with Martincheck and Coleman had 3.2 scores. The Cumberland County team managed to capture the team trophy by just squeezing out Auburndale with 11 points.

The High School Novice saw Albert Whittenberg (Cumberland County) and Danny McMillan, (Dickson County) sharing honors with 4.5 scores. Danny came into the tournament untried and emerged with a post-tournament rating of 1627—no more Novice. Champions for the final The Auburndale Team outdistanced the field by three points to take team honors with 14 points.

Bill Hall won the Junior High Championship for an unprecedented two straight. Though he was rated 2000 points above the field, his undefeated mark of six wins was not a foregone conclusion. He carried his victories, Jeff Smathers and Jay Sabine filled the next two slots with 5-1 scores, and other Martin JH players captured the next three spots. Not surprising then, Martin JH easily captured the team trophy with a 20.5 score. Memphis University trailed with 12.5 points. Gus Lipman held tough for the Memphis team by capturing 7th with a 4-2 score, tying one of Martin's stars. The 40-player Novice Section was won by Paul Larsen of Martin JH, who picked up 9.2 points with his 5-0 score. Scott Sims of White County and Manish Porubel of Memphis University took the next two spots, sharing their 4-1 scores with a host of others. The Martin JH team edged Memphis University out for the Team Championship by a point, ending up with 15 points.

Oliver Tai of Auburndale captured the Elementary Championship with a perfect

score of six to lead the field by 1.5 points. Jason Bulah, also of Auburndale, and Chris Lax (Homestead) nailed down 2-3rd with 4.5-1.5 scores. Auburndale's dominance of the Elementary Division showed with their 18.5 point team victory over the other three teams, the second of which was Homestead with 12.5 points. The Elementary Novice saw Diane Corbin squish her opposition with a perfect score of five to net the Championship and about 150 ratings points. Christy Knight (Red Bolling Spr.), Cole Whitaker (Auburndale), and Nathan Carver (Fairlane) trailed with 4-1 scores. The Team Trophy went to Auburndale—again.

This year's Primary Section had 33 players, but only one team. Alec Horgan of Auburndale triumphed with a perfect score of 5. Jonathan Smith of Franklin Road took clear second place with a 4-1 score. Auburndale received the Team Championship.

Well, another good one ends. The same name are echoing again. Will Auburndale dominate the Elementary next year? What Junior High School can accept the challenge of Martin? It was a thrilling event, and Auburndale was a gracious host. See you next year.

## National Junior HS Champs

The National Junior High Chess Championship will return to South Vigo High School in Terre Haute, Indiana, April 20-21. The eight-round Swiss System Tournament is held in two sections: ninth grade and below, and eighth grade and below. It is open to all U.S. students in ninth grade and below. The four best-scoring players from a school constitute a team for prize purposes. Trophies will be awarded to the top 15 teams and individuals in each section, as well as to the top three players in various rating categories. The members of the top five teams in each section will also receive plaques.

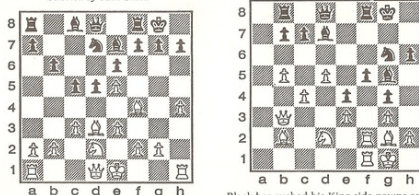

## Cleveland Championship

by Charles Laws

The first official Cleveland Championship was held December 1-15. The tournament was small, consisting of only 6 players, but it was strong. The participants were Michael Gee (1947), Robert Presswood (1858), Charles Laws (1975), Kevin Riber (UNR), Michael Guest (UNR) and Lloyd Clints (UNR).

After 3 rounds the score was Gee (2-1), Presswood (2-1), Riber (2-1), Guest (1-2), and Clints (0-3). A 3-round playoff was played to decide the champion. In the last round Gee won to avenge an earlier upset to Presswood (time forfeit) and Laws mishandled a mating attack against Gee (time pressure) to also lose to him. After the dust settled the winner was Gee (5-1) with Presswood (4-2), Laws (3-3) and Riber (2-4) trailing. Two games are presented below:

A special meeting of the Board of Directors of the Tennessee Chess Association was held at the Abundant School, Cordova, Tennessee, on Sunday, February 24, 1985, at 8:30 A.M.

Directors present were: Harry Sabine, Jim Corbitt, Dale Pickinger, and Bill Orgain. Directors absent were: Jack Smith, Peter Labbe, Richard Igo, Leonard Dickerson, Larry Thomas, and Kent Meadows.

Secretary-Treasurer Sabine presided in the absence of President Smith and Vice President Labbe. The Secretary then reported the meeting had been called pursuant to a notice of meeting in accordance with the bylaws. It was ordered that a copy of the notice of meeting be appended to the minutes of the meeting.

The minutes of the special meeting of the Board of Directors held on October 21, 1984, were read and approved.

The proposal of the Blount County Chess Club for the TCA to sponsor a team tournament was discussed. Upon motion made by Harry Sabine and seconded by Bill Orgain, the proposal was approved subject to the final details being worked out by the tournament coordinator. ## Tennessee Chess News

### The Match "Draws" to a Halt

After demolishing Karpov in the 48th game of the World Chess Championship to make the score 5-3, Kasparov was denied the advantage of momentum and psychological pressure by FIDE's president Florencio Campomanes calling an end to the affair. Campomanes said that he halted the match because it had "exhausted the physical and psychological resources" of the participants and others connected with the contest and was, further, degrading chess play with substandard play. Both players have protested the decision, with Karpov maintaining that it will damage his "sporting reputation." Nonetheless, Campomanes' decision to end the contest and start it anew September 2 under a 24-game limit stands.

The match, which began last September, saw Gary Kasparov, though both are Soviets, Karpov was the official favorite against the younger, brasher outsider (of Jewish and Armenian ancestry). The

challenger played for time, forcing a record number of draws. Karpov won a fifth game, but in the extended contest saw his lead cut repeatedly by a determined Kasparov. With an imminent threat of blowing the championship, Soviet authorities, according to the majority of the world press, stepped in to rescue a dying champion.

However the facts may be, this outcome is not all that cruel to Kasparov. After all, being down two games with your opponent only needing one victory out of three to finish you is not that considerable an advantage. Psychological pressure is not the same as physical fact. He will get a fresh, even start in September. And he will maintain some psychological momentum, besides his new confidence in himself and a sense of the champion's fallibility. With these advantages it is quite possible that Kasparov will triumph easily in his new series. Originally I had put my money on Karpov; now, I wouldn't give a plugged pawn for his chances.

Further, his comments reveal that though he has a monster rating, he has (humbly) been spoiled the monstrous chess ego. He is a master player and a nice guy!
