MIDDLE TN DIRECTOR CHANGE: BILL ORGAIN

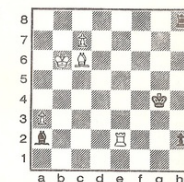

The results of the annual U.S. Chess elections saw Harry Sabine overwhelmingly chosen as a Policy Board Member at Large.

TENNESSEE OPEN CHAMPIONSHIP

Over the Labor Day Weekend at Winchester Plaza Hotel Memphis hosted an event that hasn't graced its streets in 40 years: the 1984 Tennessee Open. Over a hundred contestants exercised their brains and displayed their prowess in this first installment of the migrating Open. Familiar faces from East and Middle Tennessee proved that distance was no obstacle to their dreams (though East Tennessee was surprisingly unrepresented with but two players showing). Nonetheless, the spirit and competition at the tournament was intense and invigorating.

Boosting an average rating of 1990(!) for the 41 player open section, this hard fought tournament of equals produced three Co-Winners: David Timberlake of Arkansas, Johnson S. Moore of Nashville, and Leonard S. Dickerson of Knoxville. These three combatants each garnered \$250 for their 5-1 efforts, with an additional laurel going to Moore and Dickerson as they were declared Co-Champions of Tennessee. Johnson Moore was awarded the State Championship Trophy on the basis of his better tie-breaks.

Tied a close third was Brian McCarthy, Paul Harless, and defending champion Sid Pickard with 4.5-1.5 scores. Dale Flickinger of Memphis clinched a Class A clear first with a highly respectable 4-2 score. Other Class A winners were James A. Wright, Leroy Brown, and Guy Thompson (Southaven, MS) who had 3.5-2.5 scores.

Ronald Burnett won the State Jr. Champion Title for an unprecedented third time—three consecutive years! It seems destined that he will soon be the over-all Champion. With 16.5 points, the Memphis Chess Club edged Nashville by a half point to win the Team Champion Award. As a further result of this win, the Scrivener Memorial

Team Plaque was retired to the Pillsbury Chess Club, as the Club had captured four of the ten places.

The Amateur Section saw Ray Gattner of Memphis take a convincing first with 5.5 out of six, crowning himself Champion. Clear second was taken by Mabry Fowler, Jr. of Clarksville, MS with a 5-1 score. A three-way tie for 3rd place with 4.5-1.5 magnified Peter Lahde, Ron Fader, and Bill Orgain. Class C Champion Jeff McAdams of Memphis scored 4-2. Tying for Class C 2nd/3rd was David Wilcox and Danny Corbitt, both Memphians with 3.5-2.5 scores. The Amateur Team Champion was the Memphis Chess Club with 14.5 points.

The Novice Section's well-fought battles produced two bloodied Co-Champions with 4.5-1.5 each: Billy Courtney of Memphis and Clinton H. Pearson, Jr. of Crossville. James Alsbrook actually dominated the field with 5.5 points but wasn't eligible for top honors as he was unrated—but not any longer, as he now sports a fat 1654 rating! A two-way tie for third place saw Todd Kay and James S. Cook achieve 4-2 scores. With a 3.5-2.5 score, Russell Brooks of Madison, Alabama took a clear Class E 1st. The below 1000 1st place was captured by Elian Levatino of Germantown. Auburndale Chess Club surprised no one by securing the Novice Team Championship with a 14.5 score.

It deserves mentioning that all section winners and class winners have State Titles. Too, the nice trophies complimented the winners and were motivation in themselves for excellence.

The tournament took a loss of \$750, twice the 1983 loss. Thankfully, the Memphis Chess Club underwrote the \$300 payment for the tournament. *Continued on Page 17*

SCHOLASTIC CHESS

Scholastic chess is alive and well in Tennessee. From one end of the state to the other there are students in first through twelfth grades improving their concentration, their powers of logical thinking, their planning, and their sportsmanship as they study and play the game of chess. Scholastic chess is competition between school-aged players (grades 12 and below). Students do not have to be great athletes or mental geniuses to play chess. Moreover, chess is one of the few games where an elementary student can play a high school student or an adult on an even level.

There are four basic age groups: Primary (grade 3 and below), Elementary (grade 6 and below), Junior High (grade 9 and below), and High School (grade 12 and below). Much of the scholastic competition is between players in the same age group. In cities all across the state, there is an organized program of tournament games between players who are members of the United States Chess Federation (USCF). The USCF calculates ratings for the play-

ers based on their tournament results. We need adults who know how to play chess to help the students learn about the game. I challenge any and all adult chess players in Tennessee to contact a local school that does not already have an organized chess program and try to implement a program. Further, I challenge you to lend your support to existing chess programs. Talk to the principal and then the faculty about starting a chess club and offer your help to teach the students, faculty, and parents about chess. Once you have started the program, then develop your plans to bring high school, junior high, elementary, and primary teams to the state scholastic tournament February 23 and 24, 1985 at Auburndale school in Cordova, Tennessee.

If you have any questions about starting a chess program, or upcoming tournaments in which your players can participate, please write or call me. I will be glad to discuss with you or send you information about how to start a scholastic chess program. Good luck and see you at the state tournament in February.

SCRIVENER TEAM PLAQUE RETIRED

Among the things at stake at the 1984 Tennessee Open was the Scrivener Memorial Team Plaque. There were 10 slots on the plaque: Pillsbury Chess Club had four; Nashville had two-and-a-half; Memphis had one; and Knoxville one-and-a-half. If any other team but Nashville won this year, the plaque would be retired to the Pillsbury Chess Club next year.

This year Nashville had only four representatives — but what players they were: McCarthy, Burnett, Moore, and Meadows! Memphis had the maximum seven at Round 1 but were down to five by Round six. Pillsbury fielded a team, and Memphis had a second team, but Knoxville had only two players. It was clearly to be a Nashville versus Memphis race.

This projection was borne out during the rounds. For most of the tournament it was dead even, but, finally, Memphis won by a half point. Thus the team plaque was retired to the Pillsbury Chess Club. Through the years

(1976, 1978, and 1983 previously) the team has included Kenny Thomas, Robert Felt, Mahlon (Scott) Smith, Jack Smith, Gary Pylant, Rick Herbers, Sid Pickard, Marty Appleberry, Leroy Boyd and others. The Pillsbury "boys" also have defeated Nashville's Music City Chess Club in a postal match 4 to 2 in an all-vs-all two (2) year contest. For several regular team members this may have been the last Tennessee Open for a while as Thomas, Scott, Smith, and Herbers all have moving plans. MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE TENNESSEE CHESS ASSOCIATION

The regular meeting of the Board of Directors of the Tennessee Chess Association was held at the Winchester Plaza Hotel in Memphis, Tennessee, on Sunday, September 2, 1984, at 9:00 P.M.

Directors present were: Jack Smith, Peter Lahde, Harry Sabine, Jim Corbitt, Dale Flickinger, Richard Igo, Kent Meadows, and Johnson Moore. Directors absent was: Larry Thomas.

The minutes of the Special Meeting of the Board of Directors held on February 26, 1984, were read and approved.

The bid of the Auburndale School Chess Club for the 1985 Tennessee Scholastics was reviewed. A motion was made by Harry Sabine to accept the bid. Motion was duly seconded and approved and a copy of the bid was ordered appended to the minutes of the meeting.

Scholastic Coordinator Jim Corbitt presented a proposed format for 1985 Tennessee Scholastics which was to be the same as the format for the 1984 Scholastics except that the primary section was to be combined into one section and that two players were to be considered and counted as a team instead of four of the previous year with the top four players' scores still counted to determine the team score. Mr. Corbitt also presented a budget for the 1985 Scholastics. On motion by Johnson Moore and seconded by Richard Igo, the format and budget for the 1985 Tennessee Scholastics was approved.

The situation concerning the Tennessee Chess News was thoroughly discussed. President Smith appointed a subcommittee of the board consisting of Peter Lahde as Chairman, Johnson Moore and Kent Meadows to investigate the situation and to have mailed as soon as possible the fifth issue of the Tennessee Chess News. The committee was also instructed to investigate the possibility of putting out one more issue by some time in October and to report back to the board.

Sid Pickard, Leonard Dickerson, and Peter Lahde were interviewed by the board as possible candidates to be newsletter editor. An election was held and Leonard Dickerson was duly elected as new newsletter editor of the association to fill the unexpired term of Mark Isaac. It was also agreed that the newsletter editor would receive no pay for his services but would receive a free subscription to the *Players Chess News*. It was also agreed that the new newsletter editor would have the responsibility on his first issue to publish the December-January issue of the *Tennessee Chess News* on or about December 1.

It was agreed that there would be a special meeting of the Board of Directors to be held in Nashville, Tennessee, on Sunday, October 21, 1984, at a place to be decided in the future.

The Turkey Tour for 1984-1985 was discussed. The format as presented by Richard Igo was, upon motion duly made, seconded and carried, approved and a copy ordered attached to the minutes of the meeting.

The subject of USCF revenue sharing was discussed, and Harry Sabine was directed to make a full report on same at the directors meeting on October 21.

It was decided by the board that no additional members should be added to the board at this time.

Secretary-Treasurer Sabine was directed to look into the possibility of obtaining a cross-table from the USCF for all tournaments held in Tennessee for the newsletter editor and to report back at the board meeting on October 21.

All other matters of business, including the budget, were deferred by agreement until the next meeting on October 21.

The meeting adjourned at 11:30 P.M.

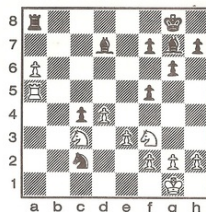

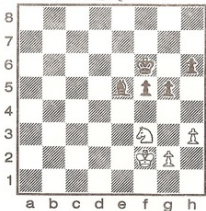

1984-1985 T.C.A. TURKEY TOUR

The T.C.A. Turkey Tour is a year long contest to help promote the current high standards of Tennessee chess participation and competition. The second annual Turkey Tour will span from September 4, 1984, thru the 1985 Tennessee Open.

For a tournament to qualify as a Turkey Tour event, the tournament must meet these requirements:

1. Be U.S.C.F. rated.
2. Require T.C.A. dues for TN residents.
3. Cannot require any other dues, except TCA and U.S.C.F.
4. Be an open weekend tournament in Tennessee.
5. Be cleared thru the TN tournament coordinator.
6. Be advertised on the TCA tournament calendar.
7. Must be at least 3 rounds in length.
8. A copy of the rating report (or final wall chart) and appropriate round fees must be submitted within two weeks by the TD/or organizer to the TCA tournament coordinator.

Prize Fund:

The prize fund will be formed from Turkey Tournament round fees (U.S.C.F. Grant Prix Events \$5 per round; and all other tournaments \$3 per round) and other donations.

Prizes will be awarded to the top players of each category by the following percentages of the Prize Fund:

CONDITIONS OF AWARDING PRIZES:

1. The final class standing of a player will be determined by the September '85 rating supplement.
2. Tour points accumulate for a player whose rating moves up to a higher class, and the player remains eligible for prizes in the lower class based on points earned prior to moving into the higher class (Based on current rating supplements during the year.)
3. Players may win only one prize.
4. Players whose U.S.C.F. Class designation shows a former rating 101 or more points over a prize group will not be eligible for that prize, but will be eligible for the prize in the next higher category.
5. Players must be T.C.A. members to accumulate and collect Turkey Points.
6. The T.C.A. Tournament Coordinator will be responsible for compiling the class standings and awarding prizes.

EARNING TURKEY POINTS:

T.C.A. Member Players may earn Turkey Points for tournament participation and performance as follows:

- (1) Each player participating in a Tennessee - U.S.C.F. Grand Prix Turkey Tour Event will earn 20 Turkey points; players participating in the Tennessee Open will earn 30 Turkey Points; and in all other Turkey Tour Events will earn 10 Turkey Points. (Players must complete at least half the scheduled rounds.)

- (2) Plus for a positive performance result (meaning wins minus losses), players will be awarded additional Turkey Points by the formula:

(Wins-Losses) times # rounds equal performance points
(Irregardless of sections)
(Based on total rounds)

Melvin also received \$100.20 for his sustained effort. Brian Smith picked up \$75.15 for his Class B final standing. Remarkable is the fact that Bill Melvin, the Class A winner, accumulated 238 points in this division before going on to out-class the Class A Section! Brian

Smith had a total of 241 points. William Orgain finished with 154 points over a closing Jeremy Hasler (138) points to win \$75.15 in the Class C Division.
