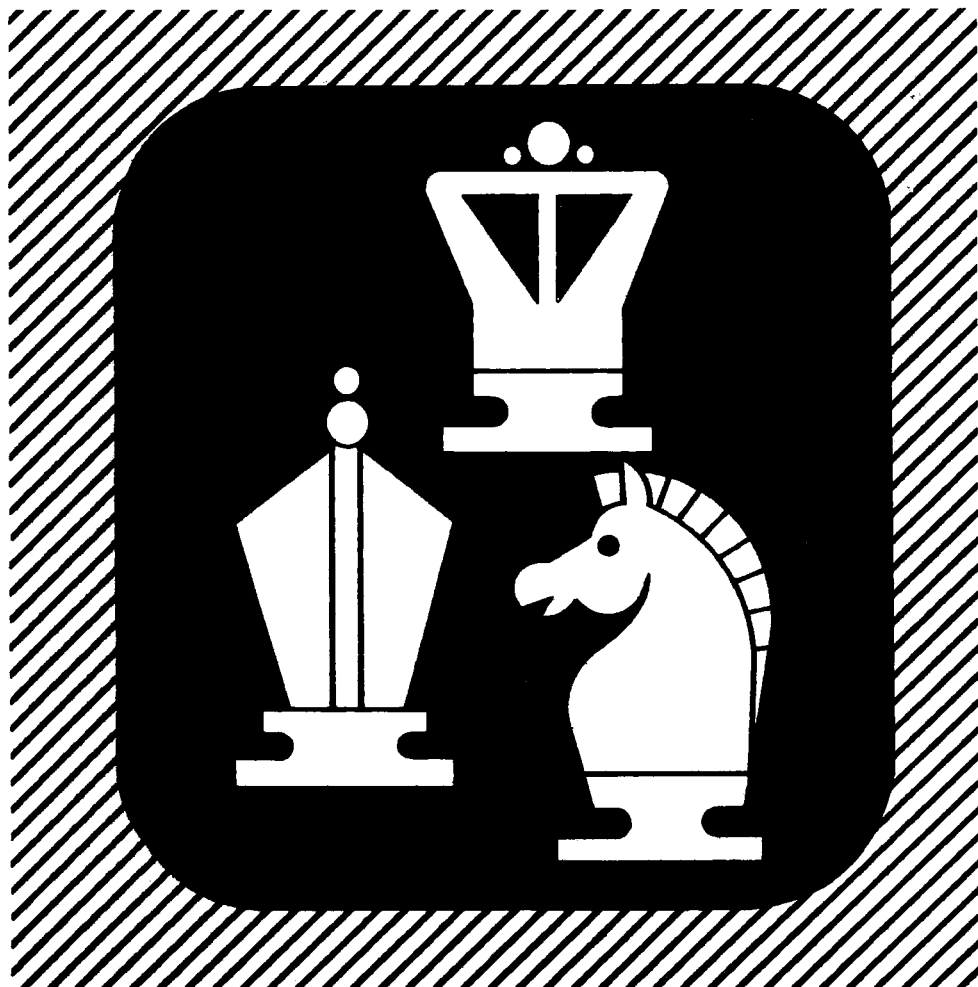

## Letters to The Editor

Many years ago, when I first started playing chess, activity in Tennessee was on the rise. The number of members and tournaments was growing, and a Tennessee B player was able to make A players and Experts from other states earn their points. The Tennessee Open had record prize funds and attendance, and the Fairfield Glade Open began to attract players from throughout the southeast. It seems that I grew up playing chess in the time of Tennessee's prime.

While many things changed for the worse in the 3 years I was out of touch, one thing didn't: the strength of our players. Never before have we had more experts and masters calling our state home, and we have one of the ten strongest junior masters in the country. It seems that even the D and E players are more fiesty, too. And let's not forget the scholastic segment which is gaining nationwide recognition. It definitely seems tougher to earn a point these days.

Nevertheless, Tennessee is at a crisis point. Our monthly magazine has changed to a quarterly, and the Tennessee Open will be considered a success if 80 people show up. Our membership is slowly failing. It is time to wake up and arrest this deterioration.

Retrospective to January 1986 and continuing until December 31, 1986, I am going to donate 10 cents to TCA for every dollar given in the form of dues, patron memberships, and any other donation except advertisement and Turkey Tour funds, up to \$100 total. That means your dues will be worth another

## The President's Column

Last time I said I would tell you what I've been doing and here it is. Scholastic chess is my first love, and I have created a healthy club in my community school. The hard work I have put into it (along with occasional help from friends) has paid off with some successful tournament scores. This has gone a long way toward putting a dent in faculty and community apathy. This summer, I plan to bring in the local Junior High Schools as well.

Secondly, your state policy board has been formulating a questionnaire which I strongly recommend you complete and send in. We cannot know what you want from your state association if you do not tell us. Of particular interest to me, will be questions concerning your willingness to participate in committees, i. e. Membership, Publicity, etc. Work required from these groups will be minimal, and the more participants we have, the easier the work load will be. Also, it is very important that we have a geographically diverse group, so don't procrastinate, send it in!!

Congratulations to Cumberland County High School for their best finish (11th Place Championship and 8th Place Novice) ever in the National Championships.

As a final note, let people know what is going on in Tennessee Chess. Newspapers, TV, and Radio stations will often give events in your area plenty of FREE publicity. The problem is that no one ever lets

40 cents and patron memberships another \$5. I am hoping to reach the limit.

I am also calling for others in the state to join me; each one will add another \$1 for every \$10 TCA receives. It isn't necessary to give \$100; anything will help.

Unlike other donations that would go directly into the TCA's budget, I would like to see the money placed in a special, secure, high interest fund, from which a percentage of the interest would be allocated to projects determined by the members each year at the TCA annual meeting. If we return a significant portion of the interest back into the fund, it will grow as the years pass and provide TCA with a stable source of income in the future. It is with this in mind that I would like to designate it the Futurity Fund.

Perhaps my dream of chess flourishing in Tennessee is not realistic; it may be that the glory days are past. Yet, I believe that it is just dormant, waiting for just the right dynamic, creative people to become involved. We have a president who is one of the most active players in the state, a treasurer who is on the USCF policy board, several young masters and experts who play in almost every tournament in Tennessee, organizers who make sure that rarely do 2 weeks go by without a tournament, plus many more. I believe the creativity and energy is already here; let us not let them fail because they are not rich enough to fund Tennessee Chess themselves. Help me help them lay the foundation of TCA's future.

## Turkey Tour (OR DO WHAT??)

The Tennessee Turkey Tour (hereafter referred to as TTT) is a year long contest to help promote chess participation and competition in Tennessee. The main idea is to give points to people participating in TTT events, have these points accumulate through the year, then award cash prizes to the people with the most points at the time of the Tennessee Open each year. There is no carry-over from year to year, i.e. you start from scratch each year at the conclusion of the Tennessee Open. How an event qualifies and how you earn points is broken down in the next section.

For a tournament to qualify, it must meet the following requirements:

1. Be USCF rated,
2. Require TCA membership for Tennessee residents. USCF membership for all participants but no other memberships.
3. Be an OPEN WEEKEND tournament in Tennessee of at least 3 rounds in length.
4. Be cleared through the Tennessee Tournament Coordinator and advertised in the TCN tournament calendar. Only one tournament will be approved per weekend.
5. A copy of the final wall chart and appropriate TTT fees must be submitted to the tournament coordinator within 2 weeks of the date of the tournament.

How do you earn points? Read on fellow TTT member and see:

1. All players, upon completion of at least one-half the scheduled rounds in a Tennessee USCF Grand Prix Turkey Tour event will earn 20 points. Completion of the same in the Tennessee Open earns 30 points and all others earn 10 points.

2. To earn more points in a said tournament, you must complete all rounds and have more wins than losses, (Byes and Forfeits count as losses). The formula for tallying your score is wins minus losses times number of rounds.

Ah!! The prize fund!! This is formed from tournament round fees (USCF Grand Prix-\$5/round; all others-\$3/round) and other donations. These prizes are then awarded by Class as follows:

Master/Expert, Class A—	1st- 10 percent
	2nd- 5 percent
	3rd- 3 percent
Class B, C, D, & E—	1st- 8 percent
	2nd- 5 percent
	3rd- 3 percent

Finally, the conditions of awarding the prized or THE RULES OF FAIR PLAY:

1. The final class standing of a player will be determined by the September 1986 USCF rating supplement.

2. TTT points accumulate for a player who moves up to a higher rating class, but the player remains eligible for prizes in the lower class based upon points earned while in that class. If a player moves to a lower class, points earned in higher class are not counted for the lower class and points earned in the lower class will not be carried forward if the player moves back to a higher class.

3. A player may earn only one prize—the greater for which he is eligible.

4. Players whose USCF CLASS DESIGNATION shows a former rating of 101 points, or more, over a prize class will not be eligible for that class prize but will be eligible for the prizes in the next higher class. Only players with permanent ratings are eligible for prizes. However, players will accumulate points during the time that their rating is provisional and those points will be credited to them in their first permanent rating class.

5. Players must be TCA members to accumulate and collect Turkey points.

6. The Tournament Coordinator is responsible for compiling class standings and awarding prizes.

The Opening Phase

by Paul Linxwiler

Frequently, a player's troubles during a game can be directly traced to errors in the opening. This is the case in the following games. In the first game we'll see a rather subtle move-order mistake. In the second, there is a more blatant disregard for opening principles.

GAME I-

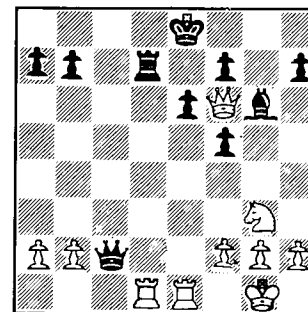
SHELBY COUNTY CHAMPIONSHIP

(RD I, 1-18-86)

White: Paul Linxwiler..... (2142)

Black: Robert Holyfield..... (2087)

1. e4 c6 2. d4 d5 3. Nd2 dxe4 4. Nxe4 Nf6 5. Nf6 + gxf6 (With this recapture, Black elects to play a much sharper game than the insipid 5... exf6 would allow.) 6. Bc4 Bf5 7. Ne2 e6 8. 0-0... (It may seem to go against principles to castle onto an open file, but the danger is more apparent than real. The White King is actually rather safe.) 8...Bd6 9. Bf4... (White opposes the aggressive placed bishop, revealing one of the benefits of temporarily keeping the Knight on e2, instead of playing an immediate Ng3.) 9...Rg8?! (This logical looking move is actually the source of Black's subsequent problems. The black King may need to seek refuge with a later 0-0.) 10. Bxd6 Qxd6 11. Ng3 Bg6 12. Re1... (White will now play an eventual d5, which subjects the black King to some "residence-related" problems. Hindsight now reveals that 9...Rg8 may have been premature, since the black monarch can no longer castle king-side.) 12...f5? (Besides blocking in the bishop, this move consumes a tempo which could have been used to develop the the Knight on b8. On 12...Nd7 13. d5 Nb6 14. Bb3 exd5 (14...Nxd5? 15. c4 wins) 15. c4! gives white an edge (15...0-0-0 16. c5!)) 13. d5! exd5 14. Bxd5 Nc6 15. Bxc6 + Qxc6 16. Qd4... (This active centralization of the queen keeps some aggressive options open for white. It also presents the potentially annoying...f4.) 16...Rd8 17. Qf6... (17 Qxa7 is met by 17...f4! White now threatens 18. Rad1.) 17...Rd2 (Better is 17...Qxc2! to prevent Rad1. Now on 18. Rac1! Qd2 is unclear. For example: 18 Rcd1 Qxd1 20. Rxd1 Rxd1 + 21. Nf1 Kd7 may be playable for black.) 18. Rad1 Qxc2?? (The final error. Best is 18...Qd6.)

18. Rcl Qxb2 (Desperation, aimed at the (very) slim chances offered by 20. Qxb2 Rxb2 21. Rc8 + Kd7 22. Rxc8 Rxa2 with two connected passes for the rook.) 20. Rxc6!... (I find a quick way to end the game.) 20...fxe6 21. Qxe6 + Kf8 22. Rc8 + Kg7 23. Rxc8 + Resigns.

(Little Rock, Ark, RD 3)

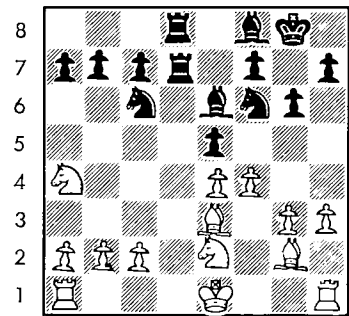

Black: Linxwiler..... (2142)

In this game, white adopts an aggressive, but dubious opening set-up.

1. d4 Nf6 2. g3 g6 3. Bg2 Bg7 4. e4 d6 5. f4?! 0-0 6. Ne2... (The awkward placement of this knight and the rather over-extended pawn center cast some serious doubts on the playability of this system. More consistent would have been 6. e5.) 6...e5! (Only one comment: equals!) 7. dxe5 dxe5 8. Qxd8 Rxd8 9. Nbc3... (Of course not 9. fxe5 Ng4 when black stands better due to the isolated e-pawn.) 9...Nc6 (Threatening Nb4.) 10. Bd2 Be6 11... (This move may seem rather unnecessary, but the immediate 11. 0-0-0 might be met with 11...Ng4! 12. Rdf1 Rd7 13. h3 Rad8, where black stands much better.) 11...Rd7 12. Na4?... (Putting the knight on the edge of the board can't be good, especially since black has a natural and good reply.) 12...Bf8 13. h3 Rad8 (Black has managed to effortlessly develop all of his pieces; a direct result of white's opening play. I now found a shot to open up the game on the disorganized white camp.) 14. Be3...

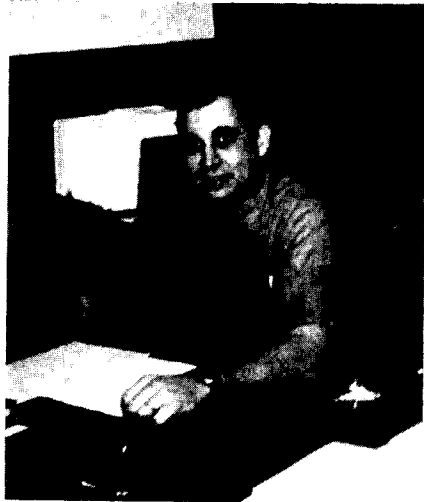

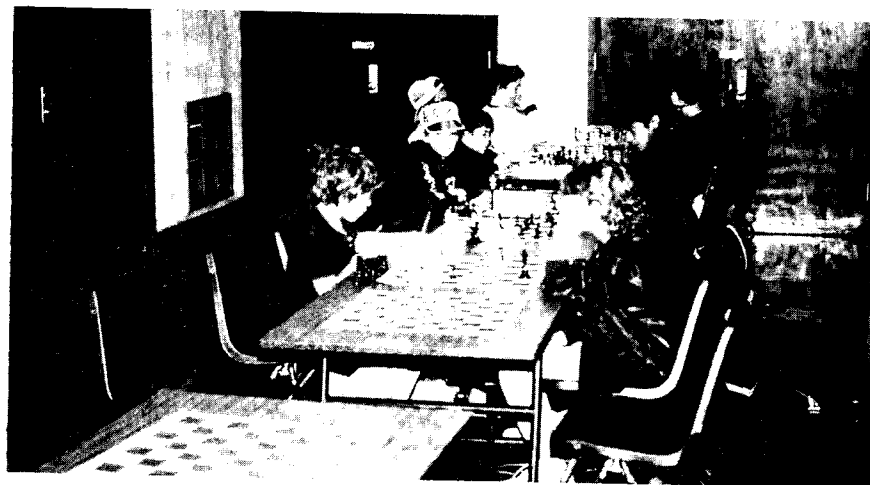

I once had the idea that the Rat player was trying to "survive" to the end-game. In an effort to frustrate this intention, I tried to dig several Rat's out of their burrows. Then I discovered the secret of the Rat. It is vicious when cornered.

Two years ago, I gave up dragging Rat's out of their holes. My new grand idea is based on the flawed idea that the Rat player is a passive, or defensive player. Now, I just sort of fool around until they decide to undertake something active. In an active game, my chances will be better. Like I said, this was my flawed plan.

Imagine my unhappiness when I found that there is a new type of Rat around. The new Rat attacks as viciously out of his burrow as he does when defending it. Below is my first encounter with this, I hope, rare sort of animal.

Qa5 Bb2+ 14. Kb1 Ndc3+ 15. Qc3 Nc3+ 16. Kb2 Nd1+ is crushing) 13. Nd5 Bb2+ 14. Kb1 Nc3+! (Of course white can't play 15. Nc3 Bc3 16. Queen moves Qb4+) 15. Kb2 Qa2+! 16. Kc3 Qa3+ (Strangely enough, I had foreseen this possibility on move thirteen. I decided that since black is attacking with only one piece, and since he has no development or open lines, and since white is almost completely developed, that black could not play this. Incidentally, what these general considerations did not tell me was black has a forced mate!) 17. Kd4 e5+ 18. Kc4 b5+ 19. Kb5 Bd7+ 20. Kc4 Rf8+ 21. Nc7 Rc7+ 22. Kd5 Be6 mate.

This combination is the most beautiful anyone has ever played against me. It took a gifted player to execute, and Erb should receive recognition for it.

Tennessee Chess President Bill Orgain headed a large contingent from near Nashville. Bill had the most notable performance overall, nicking two experts for draws and one upper 1900 for a win. Dave Jordan, next to last on the wall chart, also turned some heads. He produced a performance rating 350 points above his rating, and tied for 8th place.

Cleveland will be the site of another tournament soon, and I suggest you attend. The competition is strong, the site is spacious, and the entry fee is nominal.

## Bid Awarded to Montgomery Bell Park

On Sunday, March 2, 1986, the TCA Board of Directors convened to hear bids from Middle Tennessee clubs for the 1986 Tennessee Open. For the first time ever, more than one free site was available for consideration, thus making the Board's task a pleasant one.

Montgomery Bell State Park, on Highway 70 near Dickson, will be the site of the 1986 Tennessee Open Championship. This year marks the first time that the State Championship tournament has been held in a state park. This is also the first time that a chess tournament has been held in Dickson County, home of TCA President Bill Orgain, and is the result of his diligent efforts on TCA's behalf.

Montgomery Bell Park is one of Tennessee's most scenic locations. The park's peaceful atmosphere makes it an ideal location for a chess tournament, and Clement Lodge will make an excellent, well-lit, spacious playing site. This year's accommodations should be among the best that the Tennessee Open has ever had.

There are two special considerations for this year's Tennessee Open about which TCA members should be alerted. First, if you want to stay in the lodge or the cabins at Montgomery Bell over Labor Day weekend, you must make your reservations no later than August 1. Otherwise, you will have to lodge in Dickson, approximately 7 miles away. Second, there is only one restaurant in the park, and it is not open for dinner on Sunday night. Thus, it will be necessary either to drive to Dickson for food on Sunday night or to bring food to the park ahead of time.

## Minor Piece Endings

Gallagher (2250) vs. Ishee (2049)  
 Sicilian Najdorf  
 1/2 - 1/2, 37 Mid-South Open 1985

One of the most complicated questions in chess is the relative value of Rook vs. minor piece. When is there sufficient compensation for the loss of the exchange? Volumes have been written on this subject, and there is no simple answer.

In the following game, I prepared the Najdorf Sicilian as Black because I was aware of Gallagher's fondness for the 7.Qe2 variation. He surprised me with 10.g3!?, which in my preparations I had considered to be inferior to 10.g4. Artificial was 12.Bh4, though it did threaten 13.e5!, a move Black allowed. The resource 19...Qxc2+! is the last in a series of forced defensive moves beginning with 13...de, and produces an interesting R+B vs. 2 Rooks ending, in which Black soon proves his position is no worse.

Mark Ishee and the Fugitive Chess Club also offered a bid for Belmont College in Nashville. Peter Lahde offered a bid on behalf of the Music City Chess Club for the Quality Inn Parkway, Nashville.

A vote was taken, after much discussion, and the bid approved was the one for Montgomery Bell State Park. We should note this was the first time that more than one bid had been received for any tournament. We should thank our Board of Directors and Mark Ishee for their good work.

Bill Orgain, Rick Igou, and Mark Ishee were appointed to a committee to work out and approve the details of format and budget for the Tennessee Open. Action was deferred on the Tennessee Team Tournament, as no bids had been received.

## "QUICKIES"

Occasionally, a chess player gets the opportunity to decide the outcome of a game while the struggle is still in the opening phase. Needless to say, this possibility arises only when an opponent unwittingly cooperates by committing a serious error. Yet opening mistakes are more common than most annotators admit, even at the master level. The "trick," of course, is to find the continuation that exposes the flaw in the enemy's plan, and to follow-up with the accurate pressure necessary to force capitulation. Certainly this task is easier said than done, however, in the following game I was fortunate enough to benefit from my opponent's mistakes.

### SICILIAN DRAGON-YUGOSLAV ATTACK

Prior to 1983 this move was considered inexact due to the pawn sacrifice 9...d5 introduced by the Russian GM Konstantinov in 1937! English IM Levy, as did most authors, awards Black's 9th move an (!) in his definitive work on this opening. The Sicilian Dragon, 1972, and claims further that, "(9...c5 is probably the only equalizing line to 9.0-0-0 at Black's disposal." Indeed the Black counter-attack becomes vociferous if White accepts the pawn: 10. exd5 Nxd5 11. Nxc6 bxc6 12. Nxd5 cxd5 13. Qxd5 Qc7 and White's best choice is to try to wind his way to equality beginning with 14. Qc5; while 14. Qxa8 Bf5 15. Qxf8 + Kxf8 16. Rd2 h5! 17. Be2 Qb8 18. b3 Bc3 19. Rd5 Be6 20. Rc5 Qb4 21. Kb1 Bf6 threatening 22...Qa3 leaves Black with all the trump cards. However, White need not subject himself to such insults, as shown by the Dutch GM Timman: 10. Nxc6 bxc6 11. Bh6 Qa5 (11...Be6!7 needs to be tested) 12. Bxg7 Kxg7 13. exd5 cxd5 and here Levy ends his analysis concluding '+/+' but after 14. g4 IM Mestel lost with 14...Bb7?! while GM Sax was able to draw with 14...e6(!). My next move is a pet novelty which initiates "the war of transposition."

9...Bd7! 10. h4?! 10. g4 is virtually White's best, but Curt wants to avoid a repeat of our first encounter which continued: 10. g4 Rc8 11. h4 Ne5 12. h5 Qa5 13. Kb1 Rxc3! 14. Qxc3 Qxc3 15. bxc3

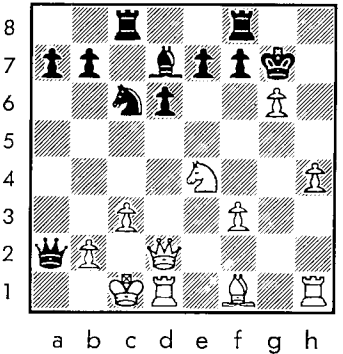
