From our in-the-mill box: we are trying to put together some All-Star Matches with border states featuring the best players from each state. Hope-

fully, this type of format will enable us to get some of the media coverage we both seek and deserve. We are also looking for some new types of tournaments and entertain suggestions on this subject. Of course, we are still committed to submitting a bid each year for some form of national tournament and will continue to do so!

Defending State Champion FM Schulien cemented his grip on the 1989 state title with this exciting win over former State Champion SM Ron Burnett. This critical last round game was the second time that the players had essayed these opening moves. Ronald held Charles to a draw with this variation in the Music City Grand Prix the previous July.

Notes are by Schulien.

Other comments in brackets ([]) by L. S. Dickerson.

FM Charles Schulien — SM Ron Burnett 43rd Tennessee Open 1989

1.d4 Nf6 2.c4 g6

Ron usually plays 2...e6, but in chess, as in other sports, good players change a losing game. Two Nimzo-Indian losses were enough!

3.Nc3 Bg7 4.e4 d6 5.f3 0-0 6.Bg5 ...

Usual is 6.Be3. This interposition helps reduce the activity of Black's Bishop as well as slightly weakening Black's Kingside.

6...h6

Also played are 6...c5 or 6...Nc6!? However, 6...e5?? allows 7.de5 de5 8.Qxd8 Rxd8 9.Bxf6 Bxf6 10.Nd5

7.Be3 e5 8.d5 Nh5 9.Qd2 f5

Ron and I both concluded the Queen sac line to be less favorable for Black with a pawn at h6. See Kasparov-Seirawan, *Chess Life*, August 1989, page 13 [That is, 9...Qh4 + 10.g3 Nxg3 11.Qf2 Nxf1!?]



If 12...Bxe4 13.Qxe4 O-O 14.Qc6

13.Bxb7 Qxb7 14.Qc2...

White waits for Black to show his hand. More active is 14.Re1 or 14.Bd2 (to bolster the Queenside defenses) or 14.Bg5 (to assist Kingside defenses).

14...Qc7

Black appears to be intimidated by White's posturing. His Queen was ideally placed for a Queenside battery. Kingside castling is still indicated.

15.Re1 O-O-O

Black does not understand the position. His strength on the Queenside is for offense, not housing the King.


16.Bd2 e5?

This unwarranted aggression may be explained by this being the money round. However, Black should be fortifying his castled position, not creating more avenues to his airy Queenside.

17.h3 g6 18.a4! ...

Standbrook reaches for his crown, snatching the initiative at Black's most overextended and indefensible point.

18...exd4 19.Nxd4 bxa4 (see diagram)

Keeping the pressure on.

8.Nf3 d5 9.a3 Bxd2 + 10.Nbxd2 Bf5 11.cxd5 Nxd5 12.Bc4 Rad8 13.Bb5 Rd6 14.0-0 Nf4

Forcing, though 14...a6 and 14...Re8 are good.

15.Rfe1 + Be6 16.Bxc6?!...

Better is 16.Re4. If 16...g5 or 16...Ng6, 17.Nc4!. If 16.Nc4, not 16...Nd3? 17.Red1 Nxd4 18.Nxd4 (18.Rxd3? Ne2 + 19.Kf1 Rxd3 and Black has some chances) but 16...Nxd4, when at worst Black has more than adequate compensation with the threats of Nxf3 + or Nc2. Also 16.Ne4 Nxd4.

16...Rxc6 17.Re3...

Keeping the Knight out of d3.

17...Nd5 18.Ree1...

Probably to contest the c-file.

18...f6 19.Ne4 b6

19...Kf7 is better. If 20.Nc5 Bc8.

20.Nc3 Nxc3 21.bxc3 Kd7

Of course 21...Rxc3? meets 22.d5.

22.Rac1 Re8 23.Nd2 Bc4 24.Rxe8...

24.Re3 is probably better. Black's better pawn structure assures favorable endgame chances, so voluntarily swapping into and endgame is not such a good idea.

24...Kxe8 25.Nf3 g5?!

25...Kf7 is a better preapration for this double-edged advance.

26.h4 h6 27.hxg5 hxg5 28.Nd2 Kd7 29.Ne4 Ke6 30.f3 Kf5 31.Kf2 Bd5 32.Nd2 b5

A radical measure to prevent 33.c4 and a possible liquidation of some Queenside pawns.

33.Nf1 Bc4 34.Ne3 + Ke6

34...Kg6 is better. This would leave the Bishop free to move and control the h-file with the King.

35.Ke1 f5 36.g3...

Now White threatens f4 and finally to free his Rook with Kd2. Black no longer can claim any advantage.

36...a5 37.Kd2 f4

Practically forced now since White threatened 38.a4! followed by Nxc4.

38.gxf4 gxf4 39.Ng4 Kf5

39...Bd5 40.Ne5 Rb6 followed by ...c7-c6 or ...c7-c5 was better.

40.Rh1 Kg5 41.Ne5 Re6 42.Rh7 c6 43.Ra7 Rh6 44.Nxc4 Rh2+ 45.Ke1...

45.Kd3 was stronger

45...bxc4 46.Rxa5+ Kh4 47.Rc5 Kg3

The presence of Black's King is very serious. White will have to go through some contortions to survive this turn of events!

White stubbornly tries for the win. 50.Re6 + followed by Rf6 should hang on to the draw, at least.

Wrong direction!

57.Rg2 + is the only chance to survive. The following long sequence is practically all forced!

The Amateur Co-Champion considered this to be his best played game. He ties down his opponent's Queenside and goes for the kill on the Kingside, showing both daring and clear visualization ability. This fighting game is an excellent demonstration of the champ's qualifications.

13.h3 e6 14.Qg5 Nc7 15.Bxg7 Kxg7 16.f4?...

Better is 16.Rad1

16...h6 17.Qg3 Nh5??

Black must have overlooked the pin. Simply 17...ed5 wins a pawn

18.Bxh5 Qf6 19.e5?! dxe5 20.fxe5 Qg5 21.Qxg5 hxg5 22.Nxg6 fxg6 23.Rxf8 Kxf8 24.Bxg6 Nxd5

24...ed5! releasing the Queenside bind was much better.

25.Ne4 Kg7 26.Bh5 Kh6 27.Bf3 b6 28.c4 Ne3

If 28...Nc7 29.Nd6 followed by Rd1.

29.Nxg5 ...

29.b3 is safer and gives no counterplay.

29...Ra7 30.h4 Nxc4 31.Re1 ...

White stakes it all on the Kingside attack as his Queenside vanishes.

31...Nxb2 32.Re4 c4

32...Re7 followed by perhaps Bb7 seems promising. Also, 32...b5 is much stronger.

33.Rf4 c3 34.Be4 ...

The Kingside attack is now in full swing.

34...Nxa4

Maybe 34...Rc7!? may have been a minor distraction? Alco, 34...Nc4 may have relieved some of the Kingside pressure, though it is about two moves too late.

35.g4 b5 36.Rf6+ Kg7 37.h5 Nc5 38.h6+ Kg8 39.h7+ Kg7

and Black overstepped the time limit (1-0)

Schulien Annotates ...

The first game below doesn't involve a Tennessean other than the notes are mine. But it should be of interest since Gata Kamsky figures to be a force in US Junior Chess, and Judit Polgar — well, many are making predictions, but life is rather unpredictable. She has a tremendous talent for chess.

Gata Kamsky – Judit Polgar New York Open 1989

1.d4 Nf6 2.Nf3 g6 3.Bg5 Bg7 4.Nbd2 d5 5.e3 0-0 6.c3 ...

The direct 6.Bd3 allows Black the equalizing variation 6...c5; 7.c3 cd4, when neither 8.cd4 nor 8.ed4 Qb6; 9.Rb1 Qe6+ yields White many chances.

6...b6 7.Bd3 ...

Surprisingly, this is not best. Since White's attacking ambitions are thwarted by ...Ne4, he should choose a positional struggle instead. Seirawan-Kudrin, 1988 US Championship, continued 7.Be2 Bb7; 8.b4 and White gained a middlegame advantage by cramping Black's queenside.

7...Bb7 8.Qe2 Ne4!


This stroke refutes White's opening — his pieces can gain no freedom through e3-e4, nor can the knight be rapidly captured. Black takes over the initiative

9.Bh4 c5 10.g4 Nd7 11.Rg1 a6 12.Bc2 ...

White prepares Nxe4, while Black prepares ...e5.

12...Qe8 13.Nxe4 dxe4 14.Nd2 cxd4 15.exd4 e5!

Black continues to open lines, which accrue to her better positional pieces. White doesn't wish to win a pawn via 16.de5 Qxe5; 17.Bxe4 due to the pin on the e-file.



Kamsky-J. Polgar Position after 15...e5!

16.d5! Bxd5 17.Nxe4 Nc5 18.a3 ...

Kamsky wishes to castle without losing the a-pawn. After 18.Nf6 + Bxf6; 19.Bxf6 Qc6, Polgar is firmly in control even without the king bishop. For instance, 20.g5 Nd7; 21.Qe3 e4 strongly favors Black.

18...Qc6 19.f3 Rac8 20.0-0-0 Bxe4 21.fxe4? ...

Why White disdains further exchanges is a mystery. In the endgame following 21.Bxe4 Nxe4; 22.Qxe4 Qxe4; 23.fe4, his control of the open d-file balances the weaker pawns. If instead 21...Qc7 or 21...Qa4, the Bishop stands much better than on c2.

It is interesting to note that although Black has played much better than White, White's game is still tenable. But from this point forward it becomes very difficult.

21...Bf6 22.Bf2 Be7 23.Rgf1...

23.Rd5 followed by doubling rooks is indicated. White's play is listless, his resistance despirited.

23...Na4 24.Be1 ...

He guards against sacrifices, but again exchanging is better: 24.Bxa4 Qxa4; 25.Qc2.

24...b5 25.Bxa4 ...

Else the pawns keep coming, but now the b-file is an offensive weapon.

25...bxa4 26.Rd5 Rb8!


Polgar shows no regard for the loose e-pawn, as its capture would allow a combination: 27.Rxe5 Bxa3!; 28.ba3 Qd6; 29.Rd5 Qxa3+; 30.Kd1 Rb1+; 31.Kd2 Rb2+ and Black wins.

27.Rf3 Rb3 28.Rf2 Rfb8 29.Qf3 Qe6 30.Qd1 ...

Ignominius retreat, but something had to be done against 30...Bh4.

30...Qb6 31.Qf3 f6 32.Qe2 Bxa3!

Black decisively opens the b-file. This sacrifice culminates her fine opening and middlegame play. Her handling of the ensuing endgame is every bit as impressive.

33.bxa3 Rb1+ 34.Kd2 Rb2+ 35.Kd3 Rxe2 36.Kxe2 Qb1 37.Rd3 Qa2+ 38.Bd2 Qc4

The queen harries the weak e-pawn and pins bishop and rook in turn. The square c4 gets revisited.

39.Ke3 Qc5+ 40.Ke2 Qb5 41.Rxf6 ...

White grabs the pawn while he can -41.Ke3 Qb6 +; 42.Ke2 Rd8 forces a favorable exchange.

41...Rd8 42.Rff3 Qc4

White holds on to his miserable pieces, but the pawns must fall. And they fall without his gaining one whit of activity.

43.Rfe3 Rxd3 44.Rxd3 Qxe4+ 45.Re3 Qxg4+ 46.Kf2 Qh4+ 47.Kg2 Qc4 48.Bc1 ...

On 48.Rxe5 Qa2; 49.Re2 Qxa3 the a-pawn decides the game. After the text move Black wins the h-pawn instead.

48...Qd5 + 49.Kf2 Qh1 50.Re1 Qxh2 + 51.Ke3 Qc2 52.Bd2 e4 53.Re2 Qd3 + 54.Kf2 h5

White is paralyzed and can only watch the advancing h-pawn.

55.Ke1 Qg3+ 56.Kf1 h4 57.Be3 h3 58.Bg1 Qf3+ 59.Ke1 Qxc3+ 0-1

The next two games were the best part of my World Open, fighting to survive against good players. Petursson eventually joined me in confusion and I beat him. Frias had the advantage all game, but was he winning?

Akiba Rubinstein's move is a solid choice; I wasn't comfortable with the currently popular theoretical variations.

Play against the hanging pawns begins with 9.dc5 bc5; 10.Ne2. Theory gives White the edge, but I wanted no part of that dynamic a position.

9...Bxc3 10.bxc3 Ba6 11.Bxa6 Nxa6 12.Qd3 c4!?

12...Nc7 maintains pressure on d4, and Black is very safe. If White now achieves the advance e4, it will be strong.

13.Qc2 Nb8 14.a4 ...

I didn't want Black to play ...b5 (after ...Nc6), when he can meet a3-a4 with b5-b4.

14.Nd2 Re8; 15.Re1 is a viable alternative, yet a quick e3-e4 doesn't suit: 15...Nc6; 16.e4 de4; 17.Nxe4 Nxe4; 18.Rxe4 Qd5 or 16.f3 Qd7; 17.e4? de4; 18.fe4 Nxd4!

14...Nc6 15.Ba3 Re8 16.Rae1 Ne4 17.Re2!? ...

I didn't want to exchange knights, but the straightforward 17.Nd2, planning f3 and e4, is correct. White instead launches protracted maneuvers.

17...f5 18.Ne1 Qg5 19.g3 ...

White prepares to maneuver his knight to f4, so Black repositions a knight to counter.

19...Ne7 20.f3 Nf6 21.Ng2 Ng6 22.Bc1 Qh5 23.h4!? ...

White gains space but also loosens his king position. Black avoids any danger of getting the queen trapped.

23...Ne7 24.Nf4 Qf7 25.Rg2 Kh8 26.Nh3 h6 27.Nf2 ...

White now plays to reach the time control at move 30 without changing the position.

27...Qe6 28.Nh3 Kg8 29.Nf4 Qd7 30.Nh3 b5!?


Surprisingly, the open b-file falls into White's hands! Black should have prepared this break with ...a6 or ...Rb8.







BURNETT SCORES BIG IN 1989 GRAND PRIX

Senior Master Ronald Burnett of Antioch has long been one of Tennessee's strongest masters, but in recent months he has been making a national reputation for himself as well. Playing almost every weekend in 1989 against the strongest players available, Ron continued to win tournament after tournament, stacking up scalps, prize checks and trophies at an astounding rate. During one especially productive portion of the year, his USCF rating climbed well over 2500, placing him within sight of the country's Top 50 list. This marks the first time a player from our state has achieved such a high national ranking.

Throughout 1989 his name was prominent among the leaders of the Novag Grand Prix, a year-long competition primarily of interest to professional chess players. Scoring any Grand Prix points at all is a difficult task, but scoring enough of them throughout the year to rank in the country's top 10 is an unprecedented feat for a Tennessean. Ron hovered consistently around 10th place, ahead of a large number of well-known GMs and IMs, and a year-end surge propelled him into 8th place at year's end!

Amazingly, Ron was not even rated on the FIDE list until very recently, and still holds no international title. But considering the large number of FIDE Masters and International Masters he has defeated, his future on the international scene seems assured. And lest we forget to mention it, Ron notched wins over three Grandmasters last year as well (and all with the Black pieces)!

With so many games from which to choose, selecting Ron's "Best of 1989" was almost impossible. He submits five outstanding games for the pleasure of TCN readers, all against Grandmasters.



The above position occurred after 43 moves in J. Tobin - M. Ishee, Land of the Sky Open 1990. White has two dangerous-looking passed pawns for the exchange in a position that at first seems difficult for Black.

In this article I will show some of the interesting and surprisingly subtle variations that can occur in this ending.

General Considerations

MATERIAL — White has two pawns for the exchange, or rough material equality.

TIME — White cannot simply play waiting moves since Black will run his Rook to the Queenside and pick up a pawn or two for free, so he must try to keep Black busy. Thanks to his passed pawns this will be easy — he plans to play h4-h5, Kh3-h4, h5-h6, Kh4-h5, Kh5-g6, h6-h7 and Kg6-g7 winning the Rook for the h-pawn. Black must act soon to prevent this plan.

SPACE — White has a space advantage because of his advanced pawns. POSITION — White has a "bad" white-squared Bishop which is tied to the defense of his white-squared pawns, while Black has an active Rook. The Black King is centralized while the White King is trapped on the side of the board and unable to centralize. White's queenside pawns are potential targets for Black's Rook, while Black's Queenside pawns on black squares are almost impossible to attack. White's only positional trumps are his passed pawns, which limit Black's activity to a minimum — without them White would certainly lose.

Because White's plan to promote his h-pawn depends upon being able to get his King to g7, Black should first of all maneuver his King to f6 to interfere with this maneuver.

44. h5 Ke7

Black can also play 44...Ke5 with the same idea.

45. Kh4 ...

But not 45.h6? Rh7 wins the h-pawn for free.

45. ... Kf6

Now Black has stopped both of White's pawns, and will try to zugzwang White away from them.

46. h6 Rh7 47. Kh5 Rh8!

The only try to win. Also noteworthy are 47...Re7 and 47...Kf5:

- (A) The apparently powerful blockade with 47...Re7 only draws after 48.Kg4! Kg6 49.Kf4! when White centralizes his King. Black must repeat the position with 49...Kf6 50.Kg4 Kg6 etc. since he can't afford to decentralize his King with 49...Kxh6? 50.Ke5 and the White King will win all of Black's Queenside pawns and the game.
 - (B) Black wakes up to a rude surprise after 47...Kf5 48.Be4 + ! deflecting the Black King from the scene of the battle. White's King plus the two passed pawns draws against Black's Rook after 48...Kxe4 49. Kg6 Re7! (not 49...Rh8? 50.e7! winning) 50.Kf6 (But not 50.h7? Rxe6 + 51.Kf7 Rh6 52.Kg7 Rxh7 + and Black wins the King and Pawn ending) 50...Rh7 51.Kg6 Re7etc.

48. Be4! ...

The right idea - the e-pawn must be sacrificed as a decoy to allow White to activate his King.

48. ... Kxe6 49. Kg6 Rg8 +!

The only move to stop White from Queening the h-pawn. Just when White finally gets his King off the h-file, Black drives him right back there.

Now White has two ways to go:

- 1. 50. Kh7? (losing)
- II. 50. Kh5! (drawing)
- I. 50. Kh7? ...

This natural move was my opponent's choice during the game, but it loses instructively.

50. ... Rg3

The right square for the Rook, where it attains maximum mobility.

51. Kh8 Kf6!

Now Black wins. Let the record show that after all this work I blundered with 51...Kf7? instead and only drew after 52.Bd5 + Kf8 53.Kh7 Rg1 54.Be4 Rg5 55.Bd5 b5 56.Bb7 ba 57.Bxa6 Rg2 58.Bb5 Rxb2 59.Bxa4 Rg2 60.Bc6 Rg5.

52. h7 ...

Also losing is 52.Kh7 Rh3 when Black will win the h-pawn with 53...Kg5 and 54...Rxh6.

52. ... Rg7

Threatens mate with Re7-Re8 and forces White's reply.

53. Bd5 Re7 54. b3 a5 55. Bg8 Re8!

Zugzwang! Now White must give away his pawns, and all Black has to do is to be careful not to allow a draw by stalemate. I present the rest of the analysis in this line as a sample variation in case there are readers who are not sure how to do it.

56. b4 ab 57. a5 b3 58. ab Rb8! 59. b7 Rxb7 60. Bd5 Re7 61. Bg8 b2 62. Bd5 b1 = Q 63. Bg8 Qa1 64. Bd5 Kg6 + 65. Kg8 Qg7 mate

II. 50. Kh5! ...

With this move White achieves a positional draw thanks to his newlyactivated Bishop and advanced h-pawn.

Black's tries are:

- (A) 50...Kf6 51.h7 (this ties the Rook to the 8th rank since now the pawn will promote with check) 51...Rd8 52.Kh6 and Black can only shuffle his Rook along the back row, since for example 52...Kf7? loses to 53.Bd5 + followed by 54.Bg8 and the pawn goes in, or 52...Ke7? allowing 53.Kg7 and the pawn queens.
- (B) 50...Rg3? 51.h7 Rh3 + 52.Kg6 Rg3 + 53.Kh6 Rh3 + 54.Kg7 Rg3 + 55.Bg6 and White wins!
- (C) 50...Rd8 (or any safe square on the 8th rank) 51.Kg6 Rg8+ repeats the position.

NEW BOOKS IN REVIEW

Chess Middlegame Planning by Peter Romanovsky (Translated from the Russian by Jimmy Adams) 232 pages, 197 diagrams. Algebraic notation. Paperback.

Every chessplayer hopes to make brilliant moves which will overcome the opponent in a blaze of glory. But such combinations come into being only as a result of proper planning, as demonstrated clearly by Peter Romanovsky in this first English translation of the Russian classic *Chess Middlegame Planning*. His lucid and penetrating analysis of the games in this volume demonstrates the imagination and creativity necessary for proper hamdling of the central stage of the game. His discussions of the stages of a plan, the significance of the center, proper play with "hanging" pawns, and the significance of the Two Bishops are of enormous practical value.

Peter Romanovsky (1892-1964) was an outstanding player in pre-Revolutionary Russia during the same time period as his close friend Alexander Alekhine, to whom he was runner-up in the first Soviet Championship in 1920. Romanovsky subsequently won the Soviet Championship twice, and was very successful in the few international events in which he participated. Romanovsky retired from competitive play after World War II, and became famous as a writer and trainer.

International Grandmaster Kotov calls Chess Middlegame Planning "one of the best books in the world's chess literature" and affirms that in it Master Romanovsky teaches "not only the fine points of modern technique but the evolution of chess ideas and the history of the game."

Soviet Grandmaster Alexander Kotov (1913-1981) was both a top-ranking player and a world-famous author. Champion of his country, winner of international tournaments, and a contender for the world chess championship, he is best known to players in the West as the author of the best-selling *Think Like A Grandmaster* and the sequel *Play Like A Grandmaster*.

Grandmaster At Work is both a collection of Kotov's best games and a textbook of practical chess play. Whole annotated games are grouped thematically, so that the book assumes the character of an original textbook on the

most important aspects of chess theory. Kotov's annotations reveal how the "laboratory of a chessplayer" works.

Author Hans Kmoch guides the reader through such basic relationships as the Bishop's aversion to rams, the Knight's attachment to stops, the Rook's dependency on levers, and the reasons why pawns should form duos. Numerous examples from tournament play provide practical examples of pawn play in action.

Pawn Power in Chess was an international sensation when it was first published in 1959, and has been received enthusiastically by chess players at all levels. Out of print for many years, this important book returns in a new edition featuring algebraic notation for greater readability.

The Correspondence Game

Congratulations to Jim Rylander on winning the 1988-89 Tennessee State Postal Chess Championship. Winn Keathley is looking for three opponents in the first 1990 section. Entry fees in the amount of \$6.00 should be made payable to the Tennessee Chess Association. All entry fees are returned in prize money.

In postal chess it is very difficult to prove whether or not your opponent is cheating. It is legal to refer to opening manuals. Most domestic organizations ban the receipt of advice from computers and other human players, but international rules permit the use of machines and are ambiguous regarding receiving advice from humans. Aside from the possibility that your opponent is receiving advice, how do you know that he isn't really Bobby Fischer playing under an assumed name? In what must rank as one of the most bizarre examples of female impersonation in world history, the British Ladies Correspondence Chess Champion turned out to be a guy named Nick.

Most types of dishonesty which are possible in postal chess could also occur in OTB tournaments. Joe Crump noted in a letter to *Chess Life* that it might be possible to modify chess computers like the concealed Blackjack computers already sold on the black market. But postal chess is different in that you are always giving a simultaneous exhibition. Suppose that you are playing a Master in an OTB game and your game follows a current postal game for 20 moves? How does the prohibition against receiving advice apply in this situation? What if the Master is playing your position in the postal game and discovers some crushing move? Are you forbidden to spring the novelty on your postal opponent? Surely the fact that you are playing, say, the Ruy Lopez, in a postal game wouldn't prevent you from playing it in OTB tournaments until the postal game is over.

Suppose that you have White against one of the best players in a postal section and Black against the other player. If all you want to do is beat the weakies and draw the biggies, you could simply let the best guys play each other, serving simply as a conduit between them. Some of you may have seen this trick on TV. It is clearly cheating and anyone caught doing it should be forfeited, but I am not aware of anyone ever being caught. Under the international time control of 10 moves in 30 days, it ought to be easier to pull off than under the old rule of 1 move in 3 days.
