The Tennessee Chess Association holds the annual Tennessee Open and State Championship over Labor Day; holds the annual Scholastic Championships and publishes Tennessee Chess News.

In 1977 and 1978 TCA also held 3 Regional Tournaments, Memphis-Nashville-Crossville, and a final 6 man round-robin Tennessee Closed Championship - both won by Tsitseklis. The Regional tournament held in Memphis lost money both times it was held and led to the demise of the system.

Recently, and interestingly from Memphis mostly, some have been complaining about the lack of TCA sponsored activity outside of middle Tennessee. We are not the only state-wide organization that must struggle with the geography of Tennessee. Many compromises have been tried, but it is inescapable that only in middle Tennessee will players from both ends of the state come to the tournaments in sufficient numbers to justify the titles.

Hence the idea of the Regionals resurfaced. Only this time with no final round-robin, the winner(s) to get free entry to the Tennessee Open, and perhaps expense money and/or room rent. This compromise reduces the financial strain on the three Regionals and would perhaps establish their viability.

The matter is to be discussed at the Tennessee Open business meeting. Write the editor with your opinions, or bring them with your vote to the meeting.

BOOK REVIEW

PLANNING IN CHESS
by Janos Flesch

Flesch is a Hungarian Grandmaster, and The author of the Morra-Smith Gambit. In this book of 80 pages he mixes philosophy with chess. I found I could do without most of the philosophy, altho it was sometimes thought provoking, and that his views on chess were much more intriguing.

The book is divided into 3 parts: 1) Material Factors; 2) Timing in the middle game; 3) Space for Manoeuvring. Under 1) there are 3 chapters: The Role of Knights and Bishops, The Role of Queens and Rooks, The Role of Pawns. His opinions include a belief that the two Bishops are over-estimated. Under 2) there are four chapters -The King remains in the Center, -The King is stranded in the Center- Castling on the same side-Castling on Opposite sides. Under 3) there are three chapters -Organising behind the lines-Positioning of the Pieces for Battle-The Restrained Front Line.

The book reminds me of Pawns In Action in that it is concise, pithy and explicit. Both books are quite valuable - after you have read (?) My System or the middle game books by Fine, Pachman or Euwe; Or perhaps in conjunction with them. Of course, not everyone has the patience to work through Nimzovich's My System; the Euwe books are out of print; Fine's book is long; Pachman's work is in three volumes, altho an abridged one volume book is available. Therefore if you want to hit the high points of chess strategy, (and perhaps flesh out your knowledge later), or if you'd like a Grandmaster's opinions, Planning in Chess may be for you.

THE CHESS ENDGAME STUDY -
A Comprehensive Introduction
2nd Edition by A.J.Roycroft

This book, a revision of Test Tube Chess, is not on problems it is on endgame studies which require a greater knowledge of endgame theory and do not specify the number of moves in the solution. Roycroft defines this kind of composition as using "the chessboard, chessmen, and chess manoeuvres in much the same way the composer of music treats sound, instruments and sequences of notes." There is much beauty in this book and the studies therein.

There is also everything anyone ever wanted to know about the subject. Which in my case was not very much. However, the book resides happily in the "library", (the one with the shower in it), and has instructional value. The endings often rival middle game combinations in depth and beauty and, at the price, is a good value for a real chess lover.

THE CHESS COMPUTER BOOK
by T.D.Harding

This book, published in 1981, is not, according to the preface "a "Which Computer?" type of guide." Rather, you are told a little about chess computer history and programming and more about what a chess computer can and cannot do, and the various features available.

Included are the results of a human versus computer tournament, a computer vrs computer tournament, sections on computer play in the openings, endings, and, their "greatest strength-the middle game" and how a player might get the greatest use from a computer. The last chapter is entitled, "Mighty Micros March Ever Onward" and is a look into the future.

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

This is not a good move for what White has in mind. The correct way to offer the Smith-Morra Gambit is 2. d4 cd 3. c3.

2. ... d6
 3. d4 cd
 4. c3? Nf6!

This equalizes instantly, since White cannot afford to ignore the attack on his e-pawn.

5. e5 ...


If 5. Bd3 dc 6. Nxc3 Nc6 clearly favors Black since White's Bd3 is misplaced in comparison with normal Smith-Morra lines.

5. ... de
 6. Nxe5 Nbd7
 7. Bb5 ...

7. Qxd4 offers White nothing, so he continues in gambit style. Note that 7. cd? fails to 7. ... Nxe5 8. de Qxd1+ 9. Kxd1 Ng4 winning a pawn.
 12. ... b5!
 13. Ne5 ...
 13. Qf3 Bc6 14. Bf4 Qb7 is no better.

7. ... Qa5
 Not 7. ... a6 8. Qa4 with pressure. After the text White must eventually lose a pawn because of the pin on c3.

8. Qe2 a6



Now I expected 9. Bd7+ Bd7 10. 0-0 dc 11. Nc3 Bb5 12. Nb5 Qb5 13. Qb5 ab with a winning position for Black (...e6 and ... Nd5 is hard to crack, and Black has pressure on a2 and an extra pawn). Instead White tries a move which, I admit, I had not foreseen. However, it only gets him in trouble.

9. Nc4!? Qc7

9... Qxb5?? 10. Nd6+

10. Nla3!? ...

Another trap, but a very shallow one that leads White into a clearly lost position. However, 10. Bd7+ Bd7 11. cd? b5! wins, or 11. Ne5 Bb5 12. c4 d3! 13. Nd3 Qc4.

10. ... e6

Not 10. ... ab 11. Nb5 followed by N(either) d6+, Nf7+ and Nh8 with advantage.

11. Bxd7+ ...

White is now out of tricks, and must exchange.

11. ... Bxd7

12. Bd2? ...

12. 0-0 dc 13. bc Bc5 and 14. ... 0-0 is not great, but it is the best White has by now. If instead 12. cd? Black wins by 12. b5! 13. Ne5 Ba3 14. ba Qc3+. Black also wins after 12. Bd2 in similar fashion after Black's next move.

White must have really been kicking himself for his faulty move-order, for now Black "accept the gambit" and wins a piece, since 14. Bc3 b4 15. Nd7 Nd7 16. Qe4 Rb8 picks off one!

14. Bf4 cb

15. resigns ...

15. Qxb2 Qa5+ wins a piece.



For this issue's idea, we go to a simple end game, won easily as long as BLACK understands KEY SQUARES.

DIAGRAM (WHITE to move)

WHITE: K on a3, Pawns on a4, b3.
 BLACK: K on b6, Pawns on a5, c3.
 Put cap. letter A on d4, B on c2.

Before embarking on your next King-Pawn endgame, look for the "key squares" and chalk up that well-earned win.

This game was played at a club match between Cookeville and Crossville on March 17, 1983. Notes by BLACK.
WHITE: Layne Shaw (1828) BLACK: Pat Burdick (1633) 1. d4 Nf3 2. Bf4 Out of book already (my book anyway)
2. ... e6 3. Nf3 d5 4. c4 Bb4+
5. Nc3 c5 6. Bxb8 I felt this was very good for BLACK. First, WHITE trades a developed piece for the undeveloped knight. Second, with BLACK's pawns heading for white squares, WHITE has traded the better bishop. And third, BLACK usually is more cramped than WHITE in these kinds of openings. The knight's exit is one less block of wood adding to the clutter, and BLACK's development is much easier. 6. ... 

MIDNIGHT OIL

When master games are suspended overnight in relatively simple settings, the result should be fairly obvious. Yet a leading expert on endgames, ex-world champ Vassily Smyslov, overlooked a resource even after burning midnight oil with a team of Soviet colleagues at the Las Palmas Interzonal 1982.

In the penultimate round Hungary's Zoltan Ribli decided to get some sleep, confident he was winning his adjourned game with Smyslov. But by morning his analysts informed him that the game should be drawn with best play. So Ribli arrived at the board expecting to split the point.

Lo and behold, Smyslov immediately made a fatal error that lost quickly. Apparently a night of hard analysis had convinced him it was lost anyway. Smyslov found no way to save the position even though he and Ribli were engaged in a tight race for first at an event designed to determine two qualifiers for the Candidates' matches, which will ultimately yield a challenger for the title.

After the game Ribli proceeded to demonstrate the correct drawing line. Flabbergasted, Smyslov couldn't believe his eyes and asked another former titleholder Tigran Petrosian to examine the analysis. Later Smyslov admitted that he and his team had done bad work.

This earned Ribli the awards for both the best game and the best endgame. The continuation from the diagram was:



SPASSKY'S COMEBACK
Former world champ Boris Spassky, 46, never quit after losing the title to Bobby Fischer in 1972. In a recent interview, when asked to describe his chess style, Spassky quipped: "First it was very brilliant, but now it's getting worse and worse." His recent result belies this modesty.

Spassky has resided near Paris for several years, ever since fighting his government for permission to marry a girl who was attached to the French embassy in Moscow. Yet he still maintains cordial relations with his native land and even played top board for the USSR in the 1978 Olympics. His compatriots describe him as a "one-legged dissident"—one foot in Russia, one foot outside.

In a field of 11 grandmasters at Linares, Spain, Spassky showed a flash of his old form by coasting to first with 6½ points, comprising 3 wins and 7 draws. Also both undefeated in a tie for a second at 6 were titleholder Anatoly Karpov and Sweden's Ulf Andersson.

Karpov missed his last chance to catch Spassky when he was held to a draw in the last round by America's Yasser Seirawan, who finished a disappointing 10th. Denmark's Bent Larsen has the dubious distinction of dead last even though he started with 2 wins before losing 8 games outright.

ATROCIOUS FORM

Despite official denials, and in clear violation of International rules, the Soviet boycott of defector Viktor Korchnoi remains in effect. The Soviet chess federation promised to send 3 grandmasters to the 45th annual Hoogoven tourney in Wijk aan zee, Holland, but withdrew them upon learning that Korchnoi was also invited.

Curiously, the Soviets no longer have that much to fear from Korchnoi even though he is in the current cycle to determine the next challenger for world champ Anatoly Karpov. Korchnoi, 52, is getting divorced and in atrocious form ever since Russia allowed his estranged wife to join him in Switzerland.

In a field of 14 Korchnoi was 8th with a dismal minus score of 6-7, including 6 outright losses! Sweden's Ulf Andersson took first at 9, closely pursued by Hungary's Zoltan Ribli (8 1/2) both undefeated. Next in line were America's Walter Brown and the Czech Vlastimil Hort (8), England's John Nunn (7 1/2), then America's great hope Yasser Seirawan (7).

Korchnoi's loss against Andersson in round 8 is almost beyond belief. It is simply inconceivable that a player of Korchnoi's caliber could lose a game in this fashion—even if he was in time-pressure. Korchnoi held an advantage all the way until his incredible decision to exchange Queens at move 49, releasing all the pressure that he had patiently accumulated. He resigned in view of 60 Bb3 Kg6 61 Ba2 Kg5 62 Bb3 Be2 gaining a second pawn.
