WILL FISCHER PLAY?

The International Chess Federation followed Bobby Fischer's wishes and named \$5 million Manila as the site of the world championship. But the Soviets objected and said challenger Anatoly Karpov's proletarian preference for \$440,000 Milan should be followed.

J. G. Prentice, deputy president of the International Chess Federation (FIDE), called FIDE and known to be in financial straits, chose Manila because the Philippine Chess Federation's bid provided not only \$5 million for the players, but an additional \$150,000 to be split between FIDE and a new fund to encourage chess in nations where the game is developing.

But the Soviet representative Nikolai Ryndin pointed out the Fischer's choice was cabled by a representative and was not signed by the champion as stipulated by FIDE rules. "In such situations, priority should be given to the challenger, who made his answer in strict conformity with FIDE rules", he said. The Soviet representative recalled that Fischer's proposal for an unlimited number of games with victory going to the first player to win 10 had been rejected by FIDE last year. "We do not support efforts to review the regulations already decided upon by FIDE," Ryndin said.

FIDE ruled last year that the championship should consist of 36 games, with the first player to win 10 gaining the title. If neither reaches 10 victories the one with the most wins at the end of the match will be declared champion, with Fischer retaining his title in the event of a tie.

If the preparations for the match will proceed as scheduled, the important decisions will be made on these dates: March 3 will be selection of the chief arbiter for the match. On March 17 the General Assembly will decide on the final rules for the match. On April 1 each player is to indicate his availability for the match. On May 1 will be final approval of the playing area. Play is to start on June 1.

Will the match come off? Your editor thinks the chances are 50-50.

McLAUGHLIN NEW HIGH SCHOOL CHAMPION

David McLaughlin of Wooddale H.S. of Memphis defeated Curt Jones of Apelle Jr. High in Nashville in the last round to win with a clean sweep the 1975 High School Championship. Curt Jones was the winner last year. Two players scored $4\frac{1}{2}-\frac{1}{2}$ to tie for second in this order after tie-breaking: 2nd Phillip Baylan of Hixson and 3rd Bruce Stearnes of MBA. Perhaps the biggest upset of the tournament was the win by Robert Gann (1368) of Notre Dame of Chattanooga over Brooks Egerton of Hillsboro in Nashville. Gann with 4-0 then lost to Stearns in the last round.

The team competition was very exciting this year with Baylor of Chattanooga challenging MBA of Nashville for the lead. But in the end MBA emerged again as the winner with 15 points and Baylor second with $13\frac{1}{2}$. Hixson finished strong to take third with 13 points. The top two teams will represent Tennessee in the Southern High School Championships. Twelve schools took part in the team competition doubling the number from last year. It was encouraging to see no less than 5 teams from Chattanooga area.

A new record was set in attendance with 84 players which nearly doubled our record from last year when we had 44. This was in large part due to the good turnout from Chattanooga. But we had good participation from all areas of the state. The competition was very keen with every game played without a single forfeit being scored. That is true competitive spirit. (For games and crosstable see other pages in this issue.)

The tournament was directed by Peter Lahde who was assisted by Glenn Cornwell. The event was cosponsored by the Tennessee Chess Association and Music City Chess Assn. The tourney took place Jan. 25-26 at the Mercury Quality Court in Nashville.

PAN AMERICAN INTERCOLLEGIATE

The University of Toronto swept through a field of 89 teams with seven wins and one draw to capture the 1975 Pan American Intercollegiate Team Championship held in Louisville, Ky. Top rated Berkeley, with four masters, could only manage six points. East Tenn. State University scored $3\frac{1}{2}$ points to capture top Tenn. team honors. This was not difficult as ETSU was the only team from Tennessee. The tournament was highlighted by a fight in the sixth round between two players over a hotel key and by a flu outbreak. Individual results of the ETSU team members follow: 1. John Smalling 1-5; 2. Gary Bawgus 5-2; 3. Rick Thompson $1\frac{1}{2}-3\frac{1}{2}$; 4. Keith Lowrey $3\frac{1}{2}-3\frac{1}{2}$; 5. Joe Johnson $2\frac{1}{2}-4\frac{1}{2}$. The team score by games was $13\frac{1}{2}-18\frac{1}{2}$.

(4) RATING SYSTEM:

The rating system used for Tenn. postal chess is similar to the Correspondence chess league of America (CCLA) system. To compute a gain/loss of rating points use the following table. The same number of points won by one player are lost by his opponent. In a draw the higher rated player loses the points indicated and the lower rated player gains.

- (b) This leaves the Queen-side too weak. Black should either transpose with 8... Q-K2 or try for refutation with 8...N-QR4.
- (c) Or 9...Q-K2 10 QxNP winning a piece.
- (d) Best is 10 BxPch! QxB (Or 10...K-B1 11 BxN RxB 12 QxNP) 11 QxP which gives White a great game as the exchange sacrifice with K-Q2 (Black's 13th) is not nearly so good with the King-side closed.
- (e) On 11 PxP BxPch is good for Black. But 11 P-N6! PxP 12 BxN B-R4 (12...BxP 13 RxP B-B4 14 P-N4 is interesting) 13 RxP P-KN4 looks good for White.
- (f) 14...NxP(!) wins faster because on 15 PxN BxPch 16 K-B1 (16 R-B2 Q-R4 17 K-B1 Q-Q8 mate) Q-B5ch.
- (g) On 17 N-Q2 N-N6 freezes the knight or N-Q2 to stop R-R8 -B8 mate (Note: Black should not try 17...P-N5 18 NxN PxR 19 N-N5 Q-R4 20 NxP as White still has some play.) The exchange sacrifice 18 RxN loses to Q-K8ch 19 N-B1 PxR 20 Q-B7ch K-Q1 followed by 21...R-B1. If 17 Q-Q1 Q-R4 18 K-B1 Q-R8ch 19 K-K2 QxPch 20 K-Q3 (20 K-K1 R-R8ch) N-B7ch.
- (h) The threat was Q-K8 mate. Or 19 N-Q2 Q-K6ch 20 R-B2 N-N5 21 Q-B7ch K-Q1 (If 21 R-KB1 R-R8ch 22 KxR Q-R3ch 23 Q-N1 Q-R7 mate). If 19 Q-B2 N-K5 20 Q-K2 (Else N-N6 and R-R8 mate) QxRch 21 QxQ NxQ 22 KxN R-R8! wins easily as White is paralyzed.
- (i) Desperation! There is no way to stop Q-K8ch. Though this game has several errors, it was hard fought. I enjoyed playing and analyzing it and I hope you will enjoy it too.
