FELDMANN AND JONES TOP HS EVENT

Scott Feldmann of Germantown and Curt Jones of Nashville topped a field of 59 players in the 7th Tennessee High School Championship sponsored by the Tennessee Chess Association. They both had a perfect 4-0 record going into the last round. As they were paired in the last round a draw was agreed shortly, as no one else would have been able to get 4½ points or more. Feldmann was the winner on tiebreak and so could carry home the 1st place trophy, but the money was split between them. Five players tied for third place with 4-1, with Mark Ishee of Nashville receiving the third place trophy with the best tiebreak. The four other players sharing in the prize fund were: David Whalley (Memphis), Harrison Gill (Chattanooga), David Freitag and Trevor Cook, Both of Murfreesboro.

The team competition was again very close and exciting. Again Baylor made a challenge for the lead, but Montgomery Bell Academy (MBA) again had the winning margin in the end when it counted. MBA scored 14 points to 13 for Baylor. This will mean that MBA for the fourth time running will be the official H.S. Team from Tennessee to be represented in the Southern H.S. Championship (March 19-20 in Atlanta). But Baylor also received a challenge for second place as Germantown was closing in. They were able to reach the same point total as Baylor with 13. But Baylor's tiebreak was much better so Baylor captured the second place trophy and Germantown took third.

The attendance this year with 59 players though slightly less than last year's was still quite good. Middle Tennessee had the largest number with 27, but closely followed by 24 by the East, and eight by the West. But this marks the first time that the four big cities of Tennessee were represented by at least one team each.

An interesting observation was made regarding the use of algebraic notation by checking the score sheets that were turned in. Only about 15% of the players used algebraic notation while the rest used descriptive. And only players that have been playing in tournaments before used algebraic, while none of the new players did. This shows that the push to encourage use of algebraic notation has not worked. One of the reasons, no doubt, is the fact that still most chess books sold still use the descriptive notation. Until more or preferably all chess books are written in algebraic can we expect a change.

The event was directed by Peter Lahde, who was assisted by Glenn Cornwell. The Tennessee Chess Association sponsored the Tournament.

"REGIONAL TOURNEYS" PLANNED

The "Regional" tournaments will be held on June 11-12 in all three regions of the state. Each tournament will be the Championship for that region. The top two in each will advance to the State Championship (July 9-10). The dividing line between middle and West Tennessee will be the Tennessee River. Between Middle and East Tennessee the dividing line is no so clear, but Cookeville will be considered East. More information later.

LAYTON WINS NEW YEARS OPEN

William Layton of Knoxville was the winner of the strong Open Division of the New Years Open, which took place December 31 - January 1 in Chattanooga. There was a three way tie for second place including Charles Maddigan (Master), John Cline (Expert), and Thomas Sweeney (Expert). Class A winners were Michael Bacon and Mack Garner. The prizes for the Class A third place were divided between Robert Frederick, Ben Sides, and Stuart Rundlett. There was a three-way tie for the class B prize money between Leland Fuerstman, Brent Looper, and Joe Rickman. The event attracted 32 players. (We did not get the results nor cross-table from this section from Robert Gann who directed. Instead we are able to report here the winners from this section which we received from Robert A. Mayer, who organized this event.)

COOK AND LAWS WIN CLASSIC SECTION

After winning their first four games Trevor Cook (1575) of Nashville and Charles Laws (1516) of Cleveland, Tennessee drew a hard fought last game to tie for first place in the Classic Section of the 1977 'New Years Open'. Cook took the 1st place trophy on tiebreak. Laws won the second place trophy. Clay Grizzle of Little Rock, Arkansas and George Jamison of Knoxville scored both 4-1 to tie for third to fourth. Grizzle won 3rd place on tiebreak. Here is the list of the winners of the Classic Section: 1st place tie: Trevor Cook and Charles Laws; 3rd place tie: Clay Grizzle and George Jamison; Class D Champion: Billy Anderson (Nashville); Class E Champion: Kenneth Albin (Hixson) and Unrated Champion: William Malone (Birmingham, Alabama). The event was held concurrently with the New Years open and TD was James Cobb.

12th CUMBERLAND COUNTY OPEN

In spite of the very icy roads and inclement weather, twenty people turned out for the 12th Cumberland County Open held on January 15 in Crossville. Bill Layton again captured first place with a perfect 4-0 record.

The Class D prize was split between Tom Collard of Crossville and John Altum of Rockwood with 2-2 records. The Class E prize was won by Mark Wiley of Crossville with 2½-1½, including a draw with Joe Roberdeau of Nashville. Harvey Hix of Murfreesboro won the Unrated prize with three points. (Reported by Harry Sabine)

JONES WINS DYERSBURG WINTER OPEN

Curt Jones (1875), a high school student from Nashville, won the Dyersburg Winter open with a 4½-½ score. David Baker (1892) of Jackson won 2nd over Philip Morgan (1875) of Memphis who took the 3rd place trophy. Sid Pickard (1456) of Millington won the Under 1800 prize, and James Blake of Madisonville, Kentucky won the Under 1400 prize.

Jones gave up a first round draw to Pickard, but then proceeded to play very strong chess in beating Roy Farr (1727), David Hawkes (1406), and M. C. Wright (2024), and David Baker. Wright, the pre-tournament favorite, lost in successive rounds to Morgan and Jones. Gary Newsom directed for the Dyer County Chess Club, assisted by Wayne Moody.

KNOXVILLE TOURNAY A DISAPPOINTMENT AGAIN

Only 17 players participated in the off again - on again ICI Volunteer 500 in Knoxville, February 12-13. The original prize fund was quite attractive but since only a small number came, the prizes had to be drastically reduced. (It seems dangerous to base prizes on 70 entries in a city that drew only 16 players the last time. Also, the information that we had that the tourney will probably not be held, I am sure did not help. Ed) Mack Garner, TCA President, was summoned at the last minute by the sponsor, International Chess Imports (Thadd Rogers, Macon, Georgia) to direct the event. The person that was supposed to direct had a death in the family and therefore could not make it.

Winner of the event was Herman Shiu (AL) with 4½-½. There was a four-way tie at 3½ for second between James Watson (NC), Joe Rickman (Maryville), Rick Carpenter (Pigeon Forge) and Greg Taylor (Knoxville).

From Alabama Chess Antics

On Jan. 1 of this year, North Carolina increased their dues to \$5 a year and on Nov. 1, 1976 the dues of the Mississippi Chess Assn. were increased by \$2, probably also to \$5 a year. This leaves only Tennessee and Alabama still only charging \$3 state membership dues in Region IV.

CORRESPONDENCE BETWEEN EDITORS

Just about a month ago I (TCN Editor) wrote to Earle Morrison (Editor for Georgia Newsletter). The exchange of these letters was also sent to the Alabama Newsletter Editor Bill Bryan. We give here the excerpts that Bill quoted in the Alabama newsletter. He starts from my letter first. "Pete says:"

"Regarding the H.S. Southern Championships I am wondering if these are now taken over by Georgia that was previously sponsored by the Continental Chess Association. Has the CCA given up their sponsorship? . . . I am certainly happy that is now in the hands of Southerners. Eventually I would like to see this tournament organized by the Region IV Southern states. In addition I would also like to see the Southern Open a Regional (Region IV) event."

Earle replies:

"It is true that the C.C.A. has pulled out of Atlanta which has put a terrific burden on the G.C.A. to hold tournaments in Georgia. I believe that Southern State Associations must cooperate in order to meet the needs of our players." "The SCA (Southern Chess Association) needs to set up a Southern Clearinghouse A.S.A.P."

"I want the Southern to be a Regional event and would like to see the growth of the Southern Chess Association."

"I am in favor of these proposals and, when the S.C.A. meets in Clemson, S.C. next July maybe we'll appoint a regional clearinghouse director."

SOUTHERN OPEN IN CLEMSON

The Southern Open has an excellent sponsor this year: the Clemson University Chess Club. Clemson put together a bid we couldn't refuse for the 56th (longest running tourney in the nation) Southern. The seven round Swiss will be in three sections July 2-4 at the Clemson Holiday Inn, Clemson, S.C.

COMPUTER RATING CORRECT

I read with interest the January 1977 issue of the TENNESSEE CHESS NEWS. You wondered in that issue whether computer technology had improved nearly 400 points in one year or whether the rating of the Chess 4 Computer Program was a mistake.

I can assure you that the rating published is correct. The computer participated in the Paul Masson American Class Championships last July in Saratoga, California, and completely wiped out the B section. Experts, however, said that the actual playing level of the computer's opponents was less than their ratings by about 200 points. Apparently, the opponents tried to be too "tricky", just as they might be with a human player, and the computer foiled them!

TARJAN PLACES THIRD AT HASTINGS

Oleg Romanishin of the Soviet Union was the decisive winner at Hastings, England, with 11½-2½, two points ahead of his nearest rival in this 15-man round robin.

Shimon Kagan of Israel was a surprising second with 9½-4½. U.S. Grandmaster James Tarjan was in a third place tie at 9-5 with Mato Damjanovic of Yugoslavia. Milan Vukcevic of Cleveland had 6½-7½ for a seventh place finish in a tie with three other players. The third U.S. representative Julio Kaplan of New York had 5½-8½ to be in an 11th place tie. M.L. ELLIS GREATER POSTAL OPEN with a \$400.00 prize fund, based on 50 entries, assignments will be in 7-man sections with mixed classes, you play white against 3 and black against 3. Play will be for 3 rounds, preliminary, semi-final and final. Those who score 4 or more game points advance from each round to the next and earn more heavily weighted points, for final tie-break if needed.

All games are rated (both TCA's postal chess rating and rating system are similar to the CCLA's system), game reports are given in this section of TCN each month and ratings of all players are published at least one time a year (as they are below). We ask new entrants to furnish their latest USCF (OTB) rating or any established postal rating. Any totally new player will be given a rating of 400 unless some proof of higher playing ability can be established. Rating classifications are Master 1000 - up, Class A 800 - 999, Class B 600 - 799, Class C 400 - 599, Class D 200 - 399 and Class E - 199.

Entry fee is only \$3.00 per section and you may enter more than one section. Tennessee residency is not required but we do require that for the first year of this postal tournament that you subscribe to TCN which will keep you up-to-date on this tournament's preliminary round. This subscription to TCN is also \$3.00 (per yr.) and should be sent with your entry fee.

Postal chess rules are very similar to over the board play, TCA's postal rules are just about the same as all postal organizations use and a copy comes with your section assignment. Postal rules also include a change of rating points chart for wins, losses and draws.

Entries will close October 31, 1977, so send your entry soon. Entries for the M.L. Ellis Greater Postal Open should be sent to: Stan Bimson, Rte #2 Box 293, Hendersonville, Tennessee, 37075.
