UNRATED PLAYER NEW STATE CHAMPION

A new record attendance was registered as 130 players took part in the three divisions of the 28th Tennessee Championships. The total represents an increase of 25 players over last year when for the first time over 100 played. The event took place at the Noel Hotel in Nashville over the Labor Day weekend (Sept. 2-4). This has been the last time for this tourney at the Noel Hotel as after this month the hotel will be closed.

Unrated Juan Aristorenas of Chattanooga is the new State Champion with a score of $5\frac{1}{2}-\frac{1}{2}$. With it he won \$150 for tieing for first and \$50 for the state title plus a trophy. He achieved this by defeating such formidable opponents as Ed Middleton of Memphis and Huntsville players Robert Rader and Marty Appleberry and drawing only Tom Jobe of Maryville. New Open Champion is Charles Alden of Lafayette, Ind. who equalled the $5\frac{1}{2}$ score. In a third place tie were Ed Middleton of Memphis, M. C. Wright and Vernon Vix both of Nashville followed by Paul Hargett of Sheffield, Ala. They all scored $4\frac{1}{2}-1\frac{1}{2}$ to divide the \$75 prize money. New Junior Champion is Vernon Vix of Nashville which gave him an additional \$25 plus a trophy. Class winners were Eddie Middleton (Class A) and Howard Sandler (Nashville) and David Ellis (Knoxville) in a tie for Class B.

The Amateur Division was won by Koji Kristofferson of Ft. Campbell, Ky. by a score of 6-0. He took the Amateur trophy plus \$100. Tied for second were John Smalling of Johnson City and Robert E. Garner of Dyersburg with 5-1. John also took the Class C and Robert the Class D trophy. Other class winners were Walter Witty and Karl Kneile (Class B), David Kushner and Glenn Cornwell (Class C), Joe Giarratano and Mike Corrigan (Class D), and Scott Smith (Unrated).

The Novice Division was won by the unrated player Joe Riegsecker of Bloomington, Ill. with $5\frac{1}{2}-\frac{1}{2}$. He won \$50 plus trophy. In a second place tie were 2nd John Cloys of Beaumont, Texas, 3rd Sam Fentress of Nashville, and Glenn Horton of Athens. All scored 5-1 with second and third place winning trophies and all dividing \$25 in prize money donated by Clayton Hamlin. The Ladies' Champion Verna Fausey received a trophy.

Nashville again took the team plaque with 16 points (4 top players count), Memphis was second with $12\frac{1}{2}$, followed by Chattanooga and Knoxville with 12 each, and Maryville was fifth with 11.

The combined three events represent a new record in the state tourney. This was largely due to the publicity the game received with the Fischer-Spassky match. This meant that mainly newcomers (about 40) helped us in achieving this record. On the other hand many of the top players were absent. Of the five experts from Tennessee there was only one and only one other expert in the tourney. (Last year there were four masters and three experts.) That is not to say that this year's open was weak as both experts had to be contend with $3\frac{1}{2}-2\frac{1}{2}$ scores.

KENNY THOMAS NEW H. S. CHAMPION

Kenny Thomas of Memphis was clear first with 5-0 in the second Tennessee High School Championships. He received the first place trophy plus \$50. Tieing for second with 4-1 were: David Kushner (Nashville), Meeks Vaughn (Kingsport), and three Nashvillians Bruce Stearns, Johnny Moore, and Brian Stephenson. They received \$8 each. Christian Brothers (Memphis) won the team trophy with Montgomery Bell Academy (Nashville) taking second.

The event attracted a record of 37 players. It took place Aug. 5-6 in Nashville concurrently with the Music City Summer tourney.

Tied for second were Eddie Middleton and Kenny Thomas with $7\frac{1}{2}$. The event was a double round robin contested by the seven strongest players in Memphis.

The "B" Division ended in a tie for first between Jim Little and Leza Sturdivant with $10\frac{1}{2}$ - $1\frac{1}{2}$. The event was a round robin affair.

DAVIES WINS MUSIC CITY SUMMER

A record of 105 entrants participated in the MCCA Summer Open and the Tennessee State High School Tournaments. The Summer Open had 68 players, and the high school tourney 37 players. An interesting observation is that 34 players, or half of those competing in the MCCA Summer came from other states besides Tennessee. In all nine different states were represented.

James Davies, an expert from St. Louis, won the first place trophy and \$150 in prize money in the Summer Open. This represents an increase in the original announced prize because of the excellent attendance. His score was $4\frac{1}{2}$ - $\frac{1}{2}$. Tom Jobe of Maryville and Robert Felt of Memphis received trophies for second and third place. Jobe and Felt plus six others (Ted Jewell, Douglas Ralston, Marty Appleberry, Brian Worley, Harris Gabel, and Wernon Vix) received \$18.75 each for tying for second place with the scores of 4-1.

Receiving class trophies and cash awards were John Reh (Class B), Rick White (C), Mike Corrigan (D), Barry Pope (E), and Kenneth Oda (Unrated).

GARNER TOPS TOM TERRIFIC TORNADO

Mack Garner, a UT law student from Maryville, took home his fifth straight tornado trophy on the twelfth of August by going 4-0 in the Tom Terrific Tornado held at UT's International House. Trailing Garner in second place was B. Thibodeaux. Paul Ilesvay, making his first tornado appearance was a strong third. Top B went to David Ellis. Rick White took the top C award while the D-E-Unr. prize went to Glenn Horton.

The surprise of this tornado had to be Ilesvay's performance in the first three rounds. Rated just 1402, Paul beat Tom Jobe, Charles Ball and David Ellis (average rating 1744)! A crosstable is on another page in this issue.

GARNER WINS FLIPDILLY TORNADO

Mack Garner completed a string of four successive tornado victories Saturday, July 22 in the Flipdilly Tornado, which set the third successive record for tornado attendance. The tournament was held in the Valley Fidelity Bank of Bearden community room, the last to be held in that location, for several reasons, the facilities are overcrowded at 20, and the management has terminated the club's use privileges. Second in the tourney was Tom Jobe, a Maryvillian recently returned from Virginia. Third was David Ellis. Garner and Jobe received trophies and Ellis won a free entry to the Tom Terrific Tornado in August. Other persons with three points were 4th Charles Ball, 5th John Smalling, 6th Ted Lundin, 7th Anthony Crawley, 8th Mark Wagner. Due to lack of space we have no crosstable for this event.
