## KENNY THOMAS RETAINS STATE TITLE

Marty Appleberry of Huntsville, Ala. is the new Tennessee Open Champion as he scored  $5\frac{1}{2}-1\frac{1}{2}$  to take clear first in one of the strongest competitions in recent years. The Open this year included two masters and five experts and also saw the return of former state champions: Robert Coveyou (1968 and many before), James Sweets (1969), James Wright (1970), Juan Aristorenas (1972) and John Hurt (1973). Five players tied for second with  $4\frac{1}{2}-1\frac{1}{2}$  including two Tennesseans. Kenny Thomas from Memphis repeated by playing some high caliber chess and thereby again winning the state title. Somewhat surprising was the excellent performance of Philip Boyer of Hixson to also make  $4\frac{1}{2}$  points to become the new Tennessee Junior Champion. He counted among his victims former state title holders John Hurt & James Sweets. The three other players scoring  $4\frac{1}{2}$  points to share in the 2nd & 3rd place money were: John Potter (VA), Timothy Taylor (PA), and Lester van Meter (MI). The Class B Champion trophy went to Joe Rickman of Maryville and James Little of Memphis won again the Class C title as last year but this time undisputed.

Memphis again took the "Uncle Bob Scrivener" Team Plaque. In fact Memphis was so confident that they did not bring back the plaque to the tournament. Maryville won the newly established Team Cup for cities with a population under 50,000. For both team competitions only Tennessee cities are eligible.

The Amateur Division was won by Herbert Mueller (GA) with  $5\frac{1}{2}-1\frac{1}{2}$ . Four players tied for second with  $4\frac{1}{2}-1\frac{1}{2}$  as follows: Wally Jordan (Nashville), Clive Morgan (FL), Jerry Wheeler (Nashville), and Charles Laws (Cleveland). Bobby Chapuis won the Class D trophy but had to share the money with Louis Gentry and Mark Smith.

The Novice Division was won by Trevor Cook of Murfreesboro with a perfect 6-0 score. Second place went surprisingly to the unrated player Jack Sprague of Memphis with 5-1. Four players had scores of  $4\frac{1}{2}-1\frac{1}{2}$  to divide 3rd place money. The woman title went to Carol Carter.

The attendance this year was on par with that of last year with 112 players this year (last year there were 113.) This is quite encouraging considering the economic crunch. But we were short of the record established in 1972 with 130 and repeated in the next year.

#### IRVINE WINS MUSIC CITY SUMMER OPEN

USCF Expert Charles Irvine of Huntsville, Alabama won the Music City Summer Open held on July 19-20 at the Mercury Motel in Nashville. Irvine made it a clean sweep with 5-0, defeating Hermitage Expert M. C. Wright in the final round.

Tied for second through fourth were Jerry Wheeler of Nashville, Henry Robinson of Clarksville and David Ellis of Knoxville. They all scored 4-1.

#### GRISBY AND VARGA WIN RATING DESTRUCTION

Lewis Grisby and Tibor Varga tied for 1st in the Rating Destruction #2 held in Smyrna, near Nashville on June 27-28. Both players started the final round with 3-0 facing each other and settle for a peaceful draw. Mark Ishee, Bruce Stearns and Glenn Cornwell tied for 3rd to 5th with scores of 3-1.

The event attracted 17 players and was directed by Joe Roberdeau. (Music City Chess)

#### MEMPHIS CHESS CLUB RATING TOURNEY

The Memphis Chess Club Summer Rating was a 8 tournament of surprises, the first being the more than usual number of entrants which included the cream of the top-notch MCC players. With 32 entrants, the organizers were forced to go to a 5th round for what had been planned as a quiet 4-round Swiss.

Early in the tourney, top-rated John Hurt, current Memphis City Champion, was surprised and upset by the pre-4th of July fireworks of Jack Smith. John's comment was, "How could I loose, I was two pawns up?" State Champion Ken Thomas was upset by Jim Rackley who steered time control close to the brink of forfeit before turning the table and forcing Ken to overstep the time control. Jim had in the previous round upset third placed Robert Holyfield in decisive combinative play. Ken Thomas came back in the 5th round and dealt a stunning victory to the tourney leader Mahlon "Scott" Smith, when Ken executed and properly recorded 10 moves in 2 minutes to overcome a time forfeit and force Scott into a blunder-prone position, gaining the victory, but losing the trophy to Scott on tie-breaks anyway.

Another eye-opening surprise was the strong collective performance of the unrated players. All of them stole rating points from the more experienced players. And even when saddled with lost positions the unrated players forced their opponents to prove themselves worthy of the win. (From the Mid-South Chess Advocate)

#### SGT. MINOR WINS BLUFF CITY OPEN

With a score of 4-1 Sgt. Ron Minor of Millington, Tenn. emerged victorious in this tournament held in Memphis, Aug. 9-10. He won four games but lost to State Champion Kenny Thomas. Four players scored  $3\frac{1}{2}$ - $1\frac{1}{2}$  in this order after tie-break: 2nd John Hurt, 3rd Kenny Thomas, Richard Matson fourth and Mahlon Smith was fifth. The Amateur was won by Charles Herbers and William Sulcer with 4-1, with Herbers taking first on tie-break. The attendance in both events was somewhat disappointing with 28 players, 13 in the Open, 15 in the Amateur.

- (a) 9...N-QR4! 10 B-Q3 (10 B-N3 was also playable) P-QN4 11 B-N5 (11 P-QR3 to prevent ...P-N5 was better) P-N5 12 N-N1 (12 N-Q5! P-N 13 PxBch Q-K2 14 Q-Q2 wins; 13... K-Q1 14 BxNch PxB 15 P-KB4, and White's position is at least as good as in the game for this N-Q5 style sacrifice, Matanovic-Tal, Portoroz 1958; 12...NxN 13 P-N P-K4 14 N-B6 and White still has the pull) 12... B-K2 13 P-B4 P-K4 and Black has the initiative, Rantanen-Reshevsky, Nice Olympiad 1974.
- (b) Some annotators suggest the refinement 11 K-N1 to slow down Black's queenside counterplay, e.g. 11...P-QN4 12 NxN QxN 13 B-Q4! P-N5? 14 N-Q5! P-N 15 BxN BxB 16 BxP and, as White's QR pawn is defended, Black is without resource ...Q-R5 and is therefore lost.
- (c) 13...NxBch 14 R-PxN N-Q2 15 N-B5 leads to a very wild game, e.g. 15...PxB 16 N-Q5 Q-Q1 17 PxB! If one likes to defend with a piece ahead, fine! If one prefers to attack, naturally the White pieces will more than do that for that purpose.
- (d) Analogous situations make chess ever more fascinating, even to the lowest level player. As if he had cooked up the position at home, Mednis sacrificed the exchange without the slightest hesitation. Perhaps his "idea" is the "refutation" of the Velimirovic Attack. Certainly the sacrifice takes the starch out of White's kingside attack, while Black retains considerable pressure on the opposite flank. The game becomes extremely sharp!
- (e) Naturally Black cannot indulge in 14...PxB? 15 NxQP! Q-Q1 16 P-QN4. 16 N-B5 R-K1 17 B-Q4, or 17 N/BxBch RxN 16 N-B6ch are lines well worth considering for White.
- (f) White has nothing after 27 QxB? NxB 28 Q-K2 NxR 29 QxN R-K2.
- (g) 27...NxB?? or 27...BxR?? 28 Q-R8ch K-R2 29 R-R7ch K-K3 30 Q-B6 mate.
- (h) After the game Bisguier exonerated Black's sac: 28...P-Q4! 29 RxB?? NxB 29 PxB? B-Q3! (threatening 30...P-K5!). White can play 29 Q-N2, but after 29...Q-QN2 (30 N-B5? NxB!), Black has a fine game!
- (i) 31...Q-K1 slows down the breakthrough.
- (j) 34 Q-R1 K-B2! 35 P-N6ch K-K1, and White's attack is nullified by the mate threat.
- (k) Even here 36...Q-K3 offers some hope.
- (l) Black lost on time. He has no defence to 41 Q-R7 anyway.
