NASHVILLE CONGRESS, FEB 24-25, 1979

Curt Jones and M.C. Wright led a field of 31 players in this event, sponsored by International Chess Imports (Macon, GA) and directed by David Thistlethwaite. Jones emerged victorious with a perfect 5-0 score, while Wright was forced to concede a half-point to third-place Kent Meadows, who also won the Class B prize. Tied with Meadows for third place were Henry Robinson, winner of the Class A prize; Alejandro Barrero; and Jody Landrum, the top Class C player. David Neill captured the Class D prize, and the Class E/Unr went to Jose Fajardo.

NASHVILLE AMATEUR, FEB 10-11, 1979

The 42-player event was won by Lweis Inman of Columbia, TN, with 4.5 points. Scores of 4-1 were made by Kent Meadows, Marshall Dieteman, Mike Abron and Jody Landrum, who finished in the order mentioned on tie-breaks. Jose Fajardo and John Moore shared the Class D prize. The event, which started at the UT-Nashville campus, moved to the Ramada Inn before the start of the second round. The tournament was directed by Peter Lahde, who simultaneously played in the Nashville Championship.

ACU-I INTERCOLLEGIATE TEAM COMPETITION, FEB 10-11, 1979

Knoxville was host to the Association of College Unions-International team competition for Region V. Forty-two players and about twenty teams participated. [As the editor has been unable to obtain the final, official results of the tournament, some of the information which follows may be in error.]

North Carolina State captured first place by scoring 7.5 points out of a possible 10. Second place was taken by the Vanderbilt "A" team with 7 points, split evenly (3.5) between Gerald Larson and Bruce Stearns. MTSU scored 6.5 points, sharing third place with several other teams. The ETSU team, represented by William Pafford and Tim Stafford, shared fifth place honors.

In the individual standings, David Freitag came in 2nd and William Pafford 4th.

ETSU WINTER OPEN, FEB 24, 1979

First place was taken by Everad Horton, second by John Nichols. James Sims directed.

CHESS WAR III, MAR 10, 1979

Twenty-two players participated in the two USCF-rated sections and thirteen others in a special unrated section of this tournament, sponsored by the Tennessee Eastman Chess Club and directed by James Sims.

The Open section was won by Charles Phillips of Asheville, NC, who defeated Bill Bickham in the final round. Leonard Dickerson took second place with 2.5 points. Barry Pope of Kingsport defeated Louis Groeniger of Knoxville in the final round of the Booster section to take first place. Dennis Stamper finished second with 2.5 points. In the Unrated section, Jerry Lewicki topped the field with a perfect 4 points, followed by Tony Ross with 3 points.

4th ANNUAL NEW YEAR'S OPEN, DEC 30-31, 1978

Curt Jones added yet another 1st-place trophy to his collection by sweeping the Chattanooga tournament with a perfect 5-0 score. Charles Madigan (IN), a master rated at 2206, took second place with 4.5 points, and Ben Sides (AL), an expert rated only one point below Jones, emerged in third place after tiebreaks over Dewey Maynard (NY), Roy Farr, and Albert Ruehmann. The Scholastics Championship, held in conjunction with the Open, was won by David Lynn, an unrated player, who scored a perfect 5-0. William Gwin came in second with 4-1.

The 68-player tournament, sponsored by International Chess Imports, was directed by L. Thad Rogers. The crosstables are published on page 26.

The unrated Pillsbury Prep, held in conjunction with the tournament, was won by Leroy Boyd (4-0) over four other entrants.

HOMESTEAD SCHOOL WINTER CHAMPIONSHIP, JAN 6, 1979

Bruce England swept the Open section with a perfect 4-0. The Elementary section was won by Karl Absher (4-0), a full point and a half above the 2nd-3rd place finishers. John White directed.

BUCKEYE WINTER OPEN, JAN 13, 1979

Noby Kawakami, an unrated player, trounced an 18-player field by scoring 4-0. Four players, led by Jonathan Alderman on tiebreak, finished with 3-1 scores. The tournament was directed by Harry Sabine.

ROGERS-WHITE TOURNAMENT, MAR 3, 1979

Thomas Collard and Bobby Wilson shared 1st-place honors in the Open section of this Crossville tournament, directed by John White. Talbot Rogers assisted. The 32-man Elementary section was topped by Chuck Lovingood and Johnny Camilleri, both of whom scored a perfect 4-0.

TENNESSEE POSTAL CHESS by Stan Bimson

1979 Tennessee Postal Championship: A cash prize fund (based on the number of entries) will be awarded to the top 3 finishers, with 50% for 1st, 30% for 2nd and 20% for 3rd. Initial assignments are 4 players to a section. You play two games simultaneously with each opponent, six games in all. A score of 4 points or more will qualify you for the finals. All games are postal rated. The entry fee is only \$3.00 per section. You may enter more than one section. Tennessee residency is not required, but, as in all TCA-sanctioned events, TCA membership is required. If you are not already a TCA member for 1979, you may send the \$4.00 TCA dues with your entry fee and you will receive your TCA membership card and this bi-monthly publication.

New entrants to Tennessee Postal Chess are requested to furnish their latest USCF rating, OTB, or any established postal rating. Send all entries to: Stan Bimson, Rt 2 Box 293, Hendersonville, TN 37075, and make checks payable to: Tennessee Chess Association.

Challenges will be presented in this section. Any player named in the challenge is under no obligation to play, so to save time it is recommended that you challenge that player directly and try to set up the match. Other types of challenges are opening designated and rating range; for example, I might challenge anyone rated above me or anyone rated between 500 and 600.

The fee for this type of match will be 25¢ per game per player. Play will comply with normal postal chess rules, except that more replying time may be added when more than two games are being played. All you need to do is (1) to set up your match and notify the postal director of the arrangements, enclosing the required fee; or (2) if it's a challenge, just send your match format with its requirements and I will offer it in this section. TN SCHOLASTICS

A record 124 entrants competed in the four-section 1979 Tennessee Scholastic Championships, held February 3-4 in Nashville. The cash prize fund totaled \$200.00; trophies were awarded the top three individuals, top girl, and top three 4-man teams in each section.

In the high school championship section, Curt Jones of Nashville, current state champion, scored 4-1 and took the top individual trophy on tiebreak over Brian McCarthy of Hermitage. Third place money was divided among five players, with Gregory Hood of Memphis taking the trophy. Christian Brothers High School (Memphis) received the top team trophy with 13 points on tiebreak over Baylor (Chattanooga); MBA (Nashville) was third with 12.

Clear first in the high school novice section went to Pamela Campbell, a sophomore at CCHS, who scored a perfect 5-0, defeating both the second and third place winners on her road to victory. Pam (photo below) was the only girl in the high school division and is probably the only girl ever to win first in any scholastic division in Tennessee. Six players scored 4-1, with Wade Morrow of Nashville and Mike Clark of Nashville receiving second and third place trophies. Cumberland County High School's team took first place with a commanding 15.5 points; Raleigh-Egypt (Memphis) took second place on tiebreak over MBA (Nashville). Both teams scored 11.5 points.

Uniform Chess Notation

Beginning January 1, 1981, the World Chess Federation (FIDE) will recognize only the algebraic notation system for its own tournaments and matches.

The eight files (from left to right for White, right to left for Black) are indicated by the small letters a through h. The eight ranks (from bottom to top for White, top to bottom for Black) are numbered 1 through 8. Each of the 64 squares is therefore identified by a single letter-and-number combination.

A move by a piece is described by the initial capital letter of the piece followed by the name of the square to which it moves. When a piece makes a capture, an x is inserted between the initial and the square. When a pawn moves, only its arrival square is indicated. When a pawn captures, however, not only the square on which the capture occurs but also the file from which the pawn is moving must be indicated, the two separated by the letter x. Check is normally indicated by a plus sign (+).

(A full explanation of uniform chess notation in FIDE-recognized form is contained in the second edition of *The Official Rules of Chess*, available from the USCF catalog.)

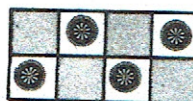

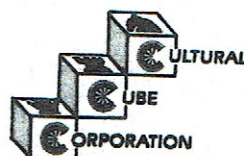
