

The President's Column

This quarter I write my column to you not only in my capacity as your state association president, but also as your state's delegate to the USCF national convention. By the time you read this article, the new policy board members will have been elected and the convention will be history. Hopefully, I will have expressed your wishes in my endeavors at Portland. However, I have nagging doubts because I have experienced little interaction with you, my constituents. I attend most tournaments across the state during the year, but few have approached me with suggestions for the convention.

Now is the time to begin preparing for next year's convention. If there is something happening in chess at the national level that you do or do not approve, then it is incumbent upon you to let your delegate and your voting members know about it. We want your positive, as well as your negative reinforcements. If you and your friends want something changed, create a petition to show us that your ideas have the support of your fellows, and we will be more than happy to present them on the floor o the convention. Continued apathy will change nothing.

I know not how my fellow voting members acted concerning the election of policy board members, but I will go over my ideas on this matter with you.

This year's election was both a pleasure and a pain for me. Candidates for the various offices were of the highest caliber, and I feel certain that the USCF is in for several good years ahead regardless of whether my personal picks are elected. On the flip side of the coin, I was disgusted by the mud-slinging personal attacks on the candidates. Most of the attacks were not generated by the candidates themselves, but rather by outside parties who view themselves as some kind of power brokers. Many of the attacks on the candidates came from a group calling themselves the Renaissance Party, who proposed an entire slate of candidates for election. Each of the candidates supported by this group quickly announced no ties to any "party". Nonethe-less, tons of work processed paper flowed from this group to voting members' mailboxes which bordered on being slanderous.

A leader of this mud-slinging crew was the vitriolic Bob Cohen of New York. This is the same man that led a lawsuit against the USCF when the delegates voted to send a national team to the Dubai Olypiad. Cohen was at the meeting when the matter was discussed, and his side was heard by all. The vote was taken and his position was found lacking in votes if not in substance when he brought his case to court. The USCF won the lawsuit, but it still cost the USCF \$6000 in legal fees. Six thousand dollars!!!! Money that could have been spent on scholastic chess, improving *Chess Life*, giving well deserved raises to USCF staff members, or simply increasing the prize fund for the U. S. Open. Now, it's lining some attorney's pocket.

All the candidates were qualified and exhibited an impressive record of past service. They should be treated as heroes and given our heartfelt thanks instead of being derided for their efforts. The losers in this election will be all of us, for I am confident that many of those that lose their respective races will be reticent to lift a finger for chess again. For that, I am very sorry. As a result of my travels, I have gotten to know all the candidates save one, and I like to call them all my friends. I hope they feel the same way about me. Needless to say, I had to make painful decisions. All my votes were cast for candidates and against no one. I will be happy to explain how I voted and why at any time. Space constraints prevent me from doing so

It is time to put aside the devisiveness that tears at our Federation. If the effort and the money that were put into this election would be directed to the growth of chess instead, we would make the Fischer Boom look like a bust. I'll get off my soapbox now.

As a final note, I wish to send our heartfelt thanks and appreciation to Rick Igou and the Knoxville Chess Club for their fine work in stagging the U. S. Amateur Championships. An excellent tourney enjoyed by all (except a few losers). The first national non-scholastic event in Tennessee in over 50 years could not have been possible without you. This Kudo's for YOU!!

USCF Short Notes

Boris Gulko Wins World Open Former Soviet Champion and celebrated refusenik GM Boris Gulko of Silver Spring, Maryland, has emerged as champion of the 15th annual World Open, held June 26 - July 5. Gulko was just one in a field of 1,293 players vying for \$181,000 in cash prizes, making this year's World Open second only in the world to last year's mammoth event in total attendance and prizes.

The impressive strength of the event is well demonstrated by some of the world-class players who did not win a major prize, such as 1986 U.S. Champion and 1987 New York Open Champion Yasser Seirawan, 1985 World Junior Champion Maxim Dlugy, New York Times Columnist Robert Byrne, and Indian sensation Anand Viswanathan.

Wolff Wins U.S. Junior Championship International Master Patrick Wolff of Belmont, Mass., has won the 1987 event. Wolff, 19, scored a convincing 8 points in nine games at the annual all-master event.

In a two-way tie for fifth place were the tournament's eldest participant, Ronald Burnett, 19, of Antioch, Tenn., and a plyer who was at age 11 the youngest master ever, Stuart Rachels, now 17, of Birmingham, Ala.

Professionalism for Knoxville U.S. Amateur Championship



Knoxville arrived on the national chess scene in spectacular fashion by hosting its largest tournament ever and its first national tournament. One hundred and forty-one players--from over half the states of the union--met at the Downtown Hilton on May 23,24, and 25 to contest the United States Chess Amateur Championship in a six-round Swiss tournament.

The energy that the organizers put into this affair was well rewarded. Conveniences and amenities such as transportation schedules and routes, local dining information, maps of nearby attractions, and a bus tour of neighboring tourist resorts was just a few of the offerings that the tournament had. Of course, excellent playing conditions and capable directorship spurred the whole event.

It wasn't the about \$800 of trophies that lured these contestants from their secret studies of killer lines and pets. It was the opportunity to be called Number One in the United States that fired their blood. And sanguine, energetic chess blazed from every board.

After the smoke of the fourth round had settled, the South looked as if it might lay claim to both the Championship and Reserve sections' titles. Timothy Brookshear of Georgia and Paul Jordan

Paul Jordan fired James Blanning of North Carolina with a sharp Sicilian to emerge the only five after fourth round action. He clearly had his sights set on the gold. Ilan Kreitner of New York showed that he, too, knew a little about the Sicilian. He got in an early d5-shot from the Black-side of the opening and refuted Timothy's premature kingside play in convincing manner. He held the spotlight in the Championship section with claim to the only five there.

Still, both players appeared to need a draw for the victory. The use of the median tie-breaker as the first tie-break instead of the cumulative almost demanded that they blaze a little more or risk seeing their dreams go up in smoke.

Number one ranked Jeffrey Ginsburg of Ohio, with a 4.5 score, was paired with Blanning. Moreover, Board 2 of the Open featured Tennessee's Mark Ishee who also sported 4.5 points. No clear champion here for sure! It appeared that the spectators were in for infernos!

Unfortunately, Mark Ishee's pieces disappeared about as fast as a slight structural crack manifested in his pawn structured. Going for his masters title, he wisely gave up a draw to Brookshear. This meant that all Ilan Kreitner had to do was hang on to a draw from Ginsburg.

With Kreitner's hanging pawns threatening to produce a passer and Ginsburg's cramped to the third rank, the draw was almost as quickly accepted as offerred. So much for going out in a blaze of glory.

In the Reserve, however, Paul Jordan was not in such a pacific mood. He set sparks flying from Chaffin's game with a pseudoknight sacrifice that shattered Chaffin's hope of upsetting Paul emerged undefeated with a perfect six Knoxville's own. score.
