

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TN CHESS HALL OF FAME NOMINATIONS

The deadline for nominating an outstanding Tennessee chess player for the Hall of Fame is March 31, 2000. Nominations should be forwarded to the TN Hall of Fame Selection Committee c/o Peter Lahde, 2609 Sailboat Court, Nashville TN 37217.

Inductees into the Tennessee Chess Hall of Fame are current or former Tennessee residents who have either distinguished themselves for outstanding achievements in the competitive chess arena or who have made significant contributions to the game of chess in Tennessee.

The following guidelines should be used in selecting a nominee:

1. The nominees must be Tennessee residents for a significant portion of their careers, or must have had significant and substantial periods of residency in Tennessee.
2. Inductees may be selected from qualified candidates either living or deceased.
3. Achievements must be significant and can be in any one or more of the following chess-related areas: competition (over-the-board or correspondence play), composition, promotion, journalism, organization, or leadership. This list is not all-inclusive and should be used for guidance only.

Please think about who you would like to see join this special group of dedicated chess players and why.

THE NASHVILLE MEMPHIS MATCH 1999

A match between these two cities took place on May 15. It was conducted as a consultation match of two games and played on the internet. Will this be a resumption of the matches that have been played on a regular basis at one time? This is also not the first consultation game ever played between these two cities by long distance. This took place in the year 1911 and was played by telegraph. In fact, in addition this was also a 12 board match that was contested at that time. But I will give you more about this very first match between these two cities in a future issue of TCN. But for now let me give you Doug Eckert's account as he describes the current match on the Memphis Chess Club website.

On May 15, the Memphis Chess Club and Nashville Club conducted their first internet match which consisted of two games using a game in 90 minutes time control. The Memphis participants were Neil Meita, Jake Kleiman, Gary Pylant, Greg Krog, and FM Doug Eckert. Also participating were the Eckert family pets, Garth, the Norwegian Elkhound, Tyler, the Cockatiel and Buttercup, the Guinea Pig.

On the Nashville side, there was Peter Lahde, Bill Orgain, Joshua Gao, and GM Palatnik, Kent Meadows and Sheff, the poodle.

The Memphis Club had White in the first game. The play was very sharp and ended in a sudden disappointment for the Memphis side.

The games are given on another page in this issue. To conclude the article I will now give you the consultation game that was played on June 15, 1911, almost 90 years ago. The game was given in the Memphis newspaper, *The Commercial Appeal*, in the chess column that appeared in that newspaper for more than 20 years and was written by Rosa Jefferson, sister of B. B. Jefferson who was twice US Open Champion in 1913 and 1914.



Memphis felt that after Nf3 could play 17...Qd6 to offer a repetition. We felt that our initiative was more than enough to consider this variation. Bf6 Fritz gives 17 e6 18 Re1 Qb2 19 Qb3 with a slight edge for Black. I do not agree with this as after 19 Bd4 to guard c5, White can play 20 Ne4 with a strong initiative. 18.Re1 Qd4 19.Re4 Qb2 20.Bb3 Bd3 21.Re3 c4 22.Nxc4 Bxc4 23.Rxc4 d6 Fritz gives 23...Bxg5 24 hxg5 Re8 and suggests White is winning. In fact, after 25 Rc2 Qg7 26 Rxe7 or 25 Qa3 26 d6 Black appears to be lost. 24.Rxe7!

Fritz gives 24 Rc2 Qa3 25 Bh6 as better and winning for White. I don't understand this. We considered the text that it must be right. The Nashville team was quite surprised with this move and felt it very strong if not winning. Bxe7 25.Bxe7 Re8 26.Bxd6 Nd7 27.Rc7 Fritz gives 27 Bb4 Qe2 28 Qd4 Qe5 as better for White, and only 27 Rc7 as equal. But I think that 27 Rc7 is better. Rac8 28.Ba4?? This loses a piece and with it the game. Fritz here suggests that 28 Rxc8 Rxc8 29 Bf4 is slightly better for White. In fact that is what we



indicated to Nashville immediately after the game. Rxc7 29.Bxc7 Qc3! Fritz gives 29...Qb4 30 Kf1 Qc4+ 31 Kg1 Qxc7 as even better. 30.Qc2 If White now plays 30 Bxd7 instead of 30 Qc2 that after 30...Re1+ 31 Qxe1 Qxe1+ 32 Kh2 Qxf2 33 Bg3 Qxa2 34 d6 White could still put up some resistance. BEREOLIS REGAINS KNOXVILLE TITLE

Master Peter Bereolos regained the Knoxville Championship that had eluded him in 1997. The last city championship took place in November and December last year. The competition was very close with Master David Sprenkle only half a point behind. They drew their individual encounter but David also gave up a draw to third place finisher and last years Junior Champion of Tennessee Nicholas Barber. The event was a six player round robin. Thanks to Richard Westbrook all the games that were played are included in this issue.

Here is the list of the title holders beginning with 1988 when Charles Maddigan held the title four years in a row until 1992 when he tied with Tom Rowan. Tom then took the title in 1993. In 1994 Charles Maddigan regained the title only to give it back the following year to Tom Rowan. In 1996 Peter Bereolos then took the title. But in 1997 there was a tie between Nicholas Barber and Tom Rowan. Then last year Peter Bereolos regained the title. (*The annotated games that were given in last issue were actually from the 1997 event and not last year as reported.*) Here is the crosstable of the results:



McLaughlin Prevails in "Nontournament" at Nashville Chess Center by Alvin Harris

The Nashville Chess Center hosted an unrated tournament on May 29, 1999, which was only open to people who had never played in a rated tournament before. The "Nontournament" drew a field of enthusiastic newcomers who, according to tournament director Alvin Harris, seemed pretty evenly matched across the board, playing at a roughly estimated 1100 - 1400 strength. Trevor McLaughlin, a student at Belmont University, proved himself to be the class of the field, winning the tournament and a 6 month USCF membership with a perfect 4 - 0 score.

One memorable moment occurred in the third round. After a hard fought battle between two of the competitors, White seemed assured of collecting a full point having achieved the following position with White to move, neither player being in serious time trouble:



Instead of the obvious Qxb2+ with mate in 1, the following series of hilarious moves occurred: 1. Qa1+?? b1=Q?? [instead of 1....bxa1=Q+ or, at least ensuring the draw with 1....b1=N+] 2. Qa3+, whereupon Black, not realizing he was in check attempted to play Qe4. The ever-alert player of the White pieces pointed out the touch-move and Black was then forced to make his only legal move, 3....Qb2. After 2. Qxb2+ Ke8, White went on to win, but not before playing 4. Qa1+?, eschewing 4. Qd2++.

For obvious reasons, Harris refused to disclose the names of the players, although he did report that one of them finished the tournament with a score of 3.0/4! If anything is to be learned from this episode, it might be that (1) Open section players have little to fear from local unrateds or (2) it's not just scholastic players that do these kinds of things.

DOUG ECKERT SWEEPS MEMPHIS CHAMPIONSHIP


