The event was a great success, even though the number of players dropped from 29 to 21. If we consider Bob Scrivener for Menaphis (where he is an officer and a valuable member), although residing in Nesbit, Misc., the number of players from Tennessee remained the same at 17. Some of the outstanding features of the event were: bob Scrivener was the only player to go through the tourney undefeated. Noteworthy also was the brilliant play of Fobert Jacobs, especially his win over Speigel. The title of highest scoring Junior from Tennessee fell to Troy Armstrong of Memphis.

The tourney was successful also from another standpoint. Good sportsmenship and plenty of interest was shown by the feet that no game was forfeited, nor was it necessary in any case to adjudicate a game.
