Qualification: Top 4 teams from each championship section in each region may play. Format: Same as Regionals except G/60;d5 Entry Fee: None; US Chess membership is required. Registration: All teams must be registered with Regional Coordinator by 5pm CT on Saturday Mar 22 . NO CHANGES in a team line-up will be permitted after that time. MUST have USCF up-to-date before registering.	Awards: Top 6 teams in each section. Plaques to top 4 players & coach of top team in each section. See scholarship information above. Check-in: 7:30 to 8:15am CST. Individual players do not check in. Coaches or a representative will check in the entire team once they have confirmed they are present. If not checked in by 8:15 they will not be paired for Round 1. Coaches meeting to be held at 8:15am. All teams should have a representative present.

1. General Rules. Each team will play a 4-board match against a different team each round. Two players on each team will play the white pieces and two will play the black pieces. Color will alternate, with boards 1 and 3 having one color while boards 2 and 4 have the other color. Each team will score 1 point, ½ point or 0 points each round. A game score of 2 points for each team is a draw and each team will receive ½ point. More than 2 game points per round wins the match for the team, while less than 2 points loses. All teams will play 4 rounds unless the number of rounds in a section is changed because there are less than five teams.

2. Schools. A school may enter only one team in each Championship Section. Schools MUST play in their geographic region. Team members MUST all attend the same school.

3. Teams. A Team consists of 4 players from the same school. Up to 2 substitutes are allowed for a maximum of 6 players per team. A team must have at least 2 players to participate. For info on Home School Teams see tnchess.us.

4. B-Team Division. A school may not enter a team in the B-Team Division unless it has a team in the corresponding section of the Championship Division. Otherwise, schools may enter as many teams as they wish in the B-Team Division.

5. Team Rating. Calculated by setting all unrated players to 300, taking the highest ratings up to 4, and dividing by 4, regardless of the numbers of players on the team.

6. Substitutes. Up to 2 substitutes are allowed per team. All substitutes must be registered (in board order) with their team by the end of registration.

7. Board Order. Board order cannot be changed after registration ends. The team must play in the same board order each round. A team with only 3 players must forfeit Board 4 each round. If a board is to forfeit any round, all remaining players must close ranks to Board 1 for that round. **Players rated over 800 must play in rating order within 100 points.**

8. Tie Breaks. If two or more teams tie for 1 st place, a 10 minute playoff match will be held to determine the champion. Otherwise, tie-break Systems used to break ties for teams tying for trophies or to qualify for the State Finals will be (1) US Team; (2) Median; (3) Solkoff; (4) Cumulative; (5) Total game points for the team; and (6) coin toss.

9. Dues. No dues shall be required for any students to play in the regional tournaments. **USCF dues** will be required for all students at the State Finals.

10. Equipment. All teams should bring clocks if available.

11. Miscellaneous. Unusual situations not covered by these rules will be dealt with by the Tournament Director at the site.
